Reports

Director Kinney thanked everyone for attending the final MIH Committee meeting of 2024. He reported that in the coming year Indiana will be getting a new Governor, Mike Braun. Within this transition there has still been a good bit of positive talk regarding MIH with the hopes of continuing to progress throughout the state. Director Kinney reported that the MIH Credentialing Subcommittee has been working diligently to create education and certification guidelines for Indiana, this includes individual certification as well as organizational.

Dr. Yazel echoed Director Kinney, stating that as he and Director Kinney are very supportive, the recognition of the work Indiana MIH provider's is being noticed on a larger scale within and outside of Indiana. Dr. Yazel reported that the local Health Departments have been partnering with their local MIH programs and utilizing the HFI funding well. We are seeing more LHD take interest in becoming programs and or partnering with local EMS or Fire. He stated that there has also been an uptrend of MIH programs partnering with their local White Flag Shelters, helping provide services to a population that doesn't always have access to basic health needs or wrap around services.

Director Kinney added that during this upcoming Legislative Session, IEMSA will be pursuing a bill that would open up the eligibility to the MIH Grants. The grants currently are only available to Cities, Towns or Townships so the bill would open the eligibility to County entities, Hospital Organizations and Private Provider Services if it passes.

Shane Hardwick reported that the MIH Credentialing Subcommittee's continued focus has been on critical areas of specialty as well as education recommendations and hourly requirements for each initiative. Mr. Hardwick states that the subcommittee meets once monthly and will continue to work towards a rough draft of ideas to submit to Director Kinney for review and produced into Rule Language. There will be more updates on this in the future.

New Business

Emily Castor reported that there were no programs to review at this time.

Old Business

Director Kinney reported all of the upcoming MIH Conferences. NAMIHP will be hosting their Tech centered conference (Tech & Prep, with a focus on data) in Tampa, FL from Sunday, February 16th, 2025 to February 18th, 2025 as well as the Atrium MIH Conference in Savannah, GA from March 25th, 2025 to March 29th, 2025. Lastly there is an in-state MIH conference that will be hosted at Valparaiso University from November 5th, 2025 to November 6th, 2025, with more information on how to register coming soon.

Emily Castor updated that the MIH Data Collection project will be opening up after the first of the year for MIH data collection. Pilot Programs will be utilizing the form for 4-6 weeks in hopes to get a clearer picture of the impact that MIH Providers are having across the state. Miss Castor reviewed some aspects of the form and reminded all the form will be available on ImageTrend.

Lisa Reed and Jen Wilson introduced Careforth's structured family caregiving program, which has been operational since 2000 and serves over 4,400 individuals in Indiana. Mrs. Reed elaborated on the Medicaid waiver requirements, detailing the challenges posed by a significant waitlist and the criteria for caregiver eligibility. She also outlined the caregiver support program, which includes daily communication with a care team and aims to reduce emergency room visits. There was a brief discussion on the referral process to

SACOA, accountability measures for caregivers, and the importance of maintaining communication with families on the waitlist.
