Rather than trying to fix the doors with no purpose in the warehouse, proponent wants approval to get the doors removed. Inspector looked at the new business, but wants the doors to remain but have signs that say out of service. Doors should remain in place in case the building is sold in the future and it goes to a new use (if something changes with the building in the future, then the doors would have to be used).

iv. 25-09-47 Project Stella (Jeffersonville) – Proponent states that the company puts safety and quality first, and is customer driven. November meeting, they were going to present an approach, and since then that information has been uploaded. Project is a campus designed, focused on Building One – which is a Type 1-B. It is noncombustible, using a precast concrete panel that is 10 inches think and has robust steel frame for columns. Project is over 800,000 square feet, there are multiple exits, and the building will have mixed used occupants in it. Really focused on H-5 (asking for 300), to get people out safely, and the building is 100% sprinklered. Building will have a fire alarm, will be notification for occupants to get out safely, and a fire loop around the entirety of the building. PPD report – covers smoke and egress variances, what makes solar cells is very long (engineers present can speak to that). Steel columns will be fireproofed, there is no second story on the roof, two (2) means of egress to get off the roof. Support letter submitted from the city of Jeffersonville in support of egress variance and removal of fire protection of secondary roof (from LBO and Fire Chief).

i. 25-10-23 College Corner Apartments (Indianapolis) – Requirements for emergency escape and rescue openings, 1029.1 doesn't apply to dorm unit in question. This is a 2-story unit, the lower level is in the basement, which is the particular unit in question. Both floors together are about 1,000 square feet. Addendum filed 9 months after CDR. Correction notice sights requirement, stating that the design utilizes table 1029.2(1). Not a correction assumption, design doesn't utilize the table but uses another section for egress design. According to proponent, the unit is in compliance and doesn't think it was well explained in the design. They are not using the table section that the design says that they are using. Making the case that they don't think it applies on the assumption that they were using a table when in fact they weren't.

ii. 25-10-24 Hub Bloomington II (Bloomington) – Gender neutral restrooms with a locker room area. Labeled as a locker room and looks like there are lockers in there. Attachment is a revised plan that labels the restroom, with no changing rooms or areas, just a gender neutral restroom on the 6th floor in the amenity area. Plan has been revised to clarify that it is just a restroom, attached a cutsheet, that the designer described, as a nonfunctional locker, essentially just a piece of art. It is a vintage locker, not a locker for use, doors will be sealed, not meant to be used as a locker. Complies with the new IBC requirements when it comes to the restroom area, individual and closed.

iii. 25-10-27 Trine University Athletic Air-Supported Dome (Angola) – Would be used for sport team practices, about 91,000 square feet, small entry area that tis 2,100 square feet (noncombustible – restroom and coaches offices). Allowable area in height – type 2-B building, fabric meets the flame propagation requirements. Dome

will comply with section 3102 of the building code, permanent structure that meets the code, except for allowable height. Seven (7) exterior doors, occupant load is about 240 (team, coaches). Not big enough to hold seating area, field practically fills the whole thing. Not a spectator type of facility. Travel distance of 140 feet maximum, dome will only be used for participant sports. Has to have enough height to allow for a functional football practice. Not adverse to safety, if there is an issue they can just leave the building. Sprinkler variance – LFO is in favor of this variance. Two fire hydrants within 300 feet, manual fire alarm systems, no fire load in the building, noncombustible construction. Hard to install a sprinkler system in a type of building like this, structure wouldn't support a rigid system. Fire access openings – requirement for non-sprinkler buildings, openings on all sides of buildings (has been previously approved), openings are on sides where fire department accesses the buildings. Wont have a voice alarm system in the building, wide open building that doesn't require special instructions (required for over 1,000 people) but this won't come close to that amount. Main exit requirement - chose not to geta variance to say we will have so many people in the building, seven (7) different ways out, more than enough to meet the requirement is the actual occupant load if taken, but don't meet for a larger calculated load. Not open to the general public, just for participant sports and for sports team practices.
