



Executive Summary

Standards Editions Adopted by the State of Indiana under Title 680 of the Indiana Administrative Code

- This document is intended to clarify the standards editions in effect under Title 680 of the Indiana Administrative Code (Boiler and Pressure Vessel Rules) at the time that this document is being written, and as noted herein (September 6th, 2012 @ 12:49 PM).
- Statutorily, the Indiana Boiler and Pressure Vessel Rules Board have been granted legislatively the authority to adopt Emergency Rules. This authority is granted solely for the purpose of updating the editions of standards adopted by the Rules Board and referenced within 680 IAC 2-1-1 in a timely manner.
- There are currently two Emergency Rules in effect;
 1. LSA Document # 11-585(E)

This document became effective October 12th, 2011 at 11:18 AM. LSA Document # 11-585(E) supersedes the text located at 680 IAC 2-1-1 (a) (1) and establishes the mandatory edition dates of all ASME standards referenced therein as the 2010 Edition, with the 2011 Addenda.
 2. LSA Document # 12-521(E)

This document became effective September 6th, 2012 at 12:49 PM. LSA Document # 12-521(E) supersedes the text located at 680 IAC 2-1-1 (a) (3) and establishes the mandatory edition date of the National Board Inspection Code referenced therein as the 2011 Edition.

- Emergency Rule LSA Document # 11-585(E), and Emergency Rule LSA Document # 12-521(E) must be read concurrently with the remainder of 680 IAC to gain an accurate picture of the mandatory dates of these referenced standards. The emergency rule text *supersedes* the editions referenced within the body of 680 IAC 2-1-1, but *does not replace it*. This fact often causes confusion because even though the text of the Emergency Rule(s) renders the text contained within 680 IAC 2-1-1 itself irrelevant, it is still there to be read.
