Reports

Dr. Kaufmann gave a brief updated on the state of Mobile Integrated Health (MIH) in the state of Indiana and the Nation. He said he was excited to see the growth of MIH here in Indiana.

Chairperson Kinney went over legislation that may impact MIH.

Program Overview

Monticello Fire Department – Nick Green gave an overview of their program.

Green is one of the first providers in the MIH program at Monticello. Their coverage area is currently within the Monticello city limits. They have not had anyone readmitted within 30 days after discharge from the hospital. They have assisted patients in understanding the doctor’s instructions. During visits they are doing things like fall risk assessments, help change smoke detectors batteries, and various other things. They have helped with transportation, internet issues, and education. Thanked the group for the grant money. Thanked everyone for their time.

Old Business

Brittany Fortinberry reported that the agency has moved forward with the contracts and expect to start distribution of the money soon.

New Business

Brittany Fortinberry reviewed the application and the information that is being collected. Chairperson Kinney reviewed the reason for the application process. Fortinberry gave an overview of the pending applications: Indianapolis EMS, New Castle/Henry County EMS, Fisher Fire and EMS and Parkview Health.
