Re: Request for Appeal Hearing

To Whom It May Concern:

We are requesting a formal administrative review of an order that was issued to our facility during a recent inspection.

The inspection was conducted by Inspector David Carpenter, who cited the Rathskeller for not having a Type I hood. He indicated "a Type I hood shall be installed at or above all commercial cooking appliances used for commercial purposes that produce grease vapors."

The cooking appliance in question is several burners that are used to heat soups and to cook pasta dishes. **Meats and other grease producing foods are not cooked on these burners**. There is a hood above these burners that connects into a Type I hood system; however, it is not a certified Type I hood by itself.

These burners have existed in their location, used for the same purposes as we now use them, covered by the same hood as now present for almost 20 years. During that period of time, the burner system has been inspected by a number of Indianapolis Fire Inspectors, who have all advised us that our use is compliant with the City Fire Code.

Following the issuance of the enclosed Inspection Report, the area was inspected by a former Indianapolis Fire Inspector and a currently serving Inspector. Both persons indicated a Type I hood was unnecessary.

Our kitchen layout, including the hood system and all fire suppression and prevention systems, has been inspected

by our different insurance carriers during the past 20 years. None of these inspections has eyer in the produced a recommendation that a Type I hood was necessary.

By the way, we requested, on two different occasions, that Inspector Carpenter bring his supervisor to our facility to review our operation and Inspector Carpenter's interpretation of 401 E. Michigan Street the Fire Code. Inspector Carpenter refused our requests.

The Rathskeller Restaurant is Indianapolis' oldest continually operating restaurant. It has been in operation in the Athenaeum Building since 1894. Our point here is that you cannot reasonably expect retroactive compliance with regulations that did not exist when this establishment opened. While we have upgraded and added various safety features over the years, insisting that a Type I hood be installed where it is not required exceeds common sense.

Please advise us of the date and location for this review. Since we have not had a reason to request such a review in the past, we also ask for guidance as to bringing exhibits and/or witnesses for this review.

A copy of the inspection report in question is enclosed.
