FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The EMSC is an agency within the meaning of IC 4-21.5.

- 2. IC 4-21.5 and IC 16-31 apply to this proceeding.
- 3. The EMSC is the state agency responsible for regulating EMT certification.
- 4. The EMSC is the ultimate authority over EMT certification within the meaning of IC 4-21.5.
- 5. At all times relevant to this proceeding, Helsley held Certificates issued by the EMSC.
- 6. On or about April 20, 2001, Helsley was charged with murdering two fellow EMTs.
- 7. On June 21, 2002, Helsley was convicted of two counts of Murder, a class A Felony, in Pike County Circuit Court.
- 8. On July 19, 2002, Helsley was sentenced to life without parole on both counts.
- 9. Murder is included in the definition of "crime of violence" as defined in IC 35-50-1-2.
- 10. IC 16-31-3-14.5 gives the EMSC the authority to suspend or revoke Certificates for any length of time including a permanent revocation of any holder who is found guilty of a crime of violence.
- 11. A conviction involving the murder of co-workers in the EMT service certainly justifies the imposition of a permanent revocation.

NONFINAL ORDER

Basic Emergency Medical Technician and Advanced Emergency Medical Technician Certificate No. 46461 and Green Light Permit No. 46461 held by Christopher Helsley are hereby permanently revoked.
