

Snapshot IN Summary 2015-2016

Thank you so much to everyone who participated in the pilot season of Snapshot IN! Included is a summary of the total number of photos taken of each species. Excluding images of people, 47,134 photos will be included in the analysis. Much to the excitement of the biologists, the first record of a bobcat in Boone County was captured by one of the cameras set up by a Snapshot volunteer!

The cameras detected 42 species, among which white-tailed deer were by far the least camera shy. No photos of beavers, badgers, or muskrats were captured, likely because few cameras were located near habitats used by these animals.

The biologists are excited to process the data to estimate relative abundance and diversity of the wildlife in Indiana, and add another great tool for detecting wildlife to their programs. The protocols will be refined, and the program will be up and running again in the near future!
