
Walleye Tagging Study



The Indiana Department of Natural Resources is conducting a walleye tagging study on Monroe Lake. Walleye may be tagged near the fish's dorsal fin.

How Can You Help

- Inspect all walleye caught and look for tag(s). When a tag has been in water, algae forms, resulting in the tag appearing brown or black. Some walleye may be double tagged.
- Remove the tag(s) with a knife or scissors.
- Report the capture of a tagged fish to the DNR. Tag return envelopes are available at Monroe Lake boat ramps, gate houses, DNR Paynetown office, DNR Bloomington office or by mail: IDNR Bloomington Field Office, 5596 E. State Road 46, Bloomington, IN 47401.
- Fill out the information on the tag return envelope and drop the tag/tags into the envelope. Envelopes can be returned to wherever you obtained the envelope. Please only include tag(s) from one fish per envelope. If you do not have a tag return envelope please return the tag with the following information to DNR Bloomington Field Office 5596 East State Road 46 Bloomington, IN 47401:
 - Tag number/numbers. (See example of a tag for location of tag number.)
 - Month, day, and year of capture.
 - If you released the fish or brought it home.
 - Your name and address.
