

TO LINTON

- Hillenbrand FWA, the managing property of Goose Pond FWA, is located south on S.R. 59. It
- Greene-Sullivan State Forest provides camp sites, trails and more than 100 fishing lakes.
- Nearby Shakamak State Park provides opportunity for camping, picnic areas and a family aquatic center for swimming.
- Minnehaha provides 3,500 acres of rolling grasslands and wooded areas with 450 acres of available water.

#### Neighboring Land

Hillenbrand Fish & Wildlife Area was purchased by the state in 1995. Wildlife management efforts began immediately on the 3,631 acres of mostly reclaimed surface mine land in Greene County. Hillenbrand is 60 percent grasslands with 125 acres of wetland habitat. The property is named after Indiana businessman John A. Hillenbrand II for his dedication to Indiana's natural resources.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

In addition to state fish and wildlife laws, this property is governed by posted regulations affecting the public use of lands and facilities owned, leased or licensed by the DNR.

### HISTORY



Hillenbrand Fish & Wildlife Area is dedicated to providing quality hunting and fishing opportunities while maintaining 3,631 acres of upland game and wetland habitat, lakes and shallow impoundments. It is located east and west of S.R. 59 approximately 5 miles north of Linton.

**Camping/Swimming**  
Camping and swimming are prohibited.

**Traffic**  
Traffic on public roads through Hillenbrand FWA is governed by state and county laws. All other roads are limited to foot traffic only.

- No check-in or written permission is required for fishing. There is a minimum size limit of 14-inches for largemouth bass in effect on all state-owned, operated or leased waters except for free flowing streams. Some restrictions may limit fishing during waterfowl hunting season. Call Goose Pond FWA for details (812) 659-9901.

**Permits**  
In addition to a hunting and/or fishing license, the following permits are required for the following activities:

**Responsibility**  
The DNR will not be held responsible for any accidents or deaths occurring from the use of these facilities.

**Violations**  
Violation of any law, rule or regulation governing this property may be cause for forfeiture of your hunting, fishing or visiting privileges at Hillenbrand FWA.

**Posted Areas**  
Safety zones, refuges, waterfowl resting and other restricted areas are marked with appropriate signs.

- Redbird State Recreation Area offers Off-Road Vehicle (ORV) riding opportunities.

**WILDLIFE WATCHING**  
Enjoy watching deer, wild turkey and various bird species on the 3,631 acres of Hillenbrand FWA. Large congregations of migratory waterfowl can be seen in the wetland areas.

**TRAPPING**  
Call property for regulations.

- Check-in is required. Small game, deer and waterfowl hunters can pick up daily permits at a self-service check-in area (see map). Turkey hunters must check-in at Goose Pond FWA located two miles south of Linton on S.R. 59. Pre-registration is required for wild turkey. Call Goose Pond FWA (812) 659-9901 for drawing times and location.
- Deer, rabbit, dove, quail and woodcock are common at Hillenbrand Fish & Wildlife Area. Limited hunting for wild turkey and waterfowl is available.

**HUNTING**  
There is a 14-inch minimum size limit on large-mouth bass. All other size and bag limits apply.

- Hillenbrand FWA has 125 acres of available water—11 impoundments, including 27-acre Horseshoe Lake.
- Primary species include bass, bluegill, redear, crappie and catfish.
- Gilmour, Crystal, Long, Moss, Midland, Beaver Dam and Front lakes have gravel boat ramps.
- All lakes are limited to a maximum 12-volt electric motor.
- No check-in is required for fishing. However, check for closures during waterfowl hunting season.
- There is a 14-inch minimum size limit on large-mouth bass. All other size and bag limits apply.

**FISHING**  
Target shooting is prohibited.

### ADDITIONAL OPPORTUNITIES

- Wetland trapping is available by drawing only. Ask for details at Goose Pond FWA headquarters.
- Accessible hunting areas are available at Hillenbrand FWA. Ask for details at Goose Pond FWA headquarters.
- Berries, mushrooms and nuts may be gathered from Hillenbrand FWA.

### FUNDING FOR FISH AND WILDLIFE

The DNR Division of Fish & Wildlife sells hunting, fishing, and trapping licenses. All revenue is used for managing fish and wildlife resources in Indiana. No license money goes into the state general fund.


The DNR Division of Fish & Wildlife sections also receive money through the Sport Fish and Wildlife Restoration Program administered by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Indiana receives approximately \$11 for every person that purchases a fishing license and \$22 for every person that purchases a hunting license. Currently, Indiana receives approximately \$8 million in federal reimbursement. This money is used to manage fish and wildlife resources in Indiana. So, even if you don't hunt or fish, you can buy a combination license at \$25/year and Indiana will receive an additional \$33 in federal funds to be used for fish and wildlife conservation.
