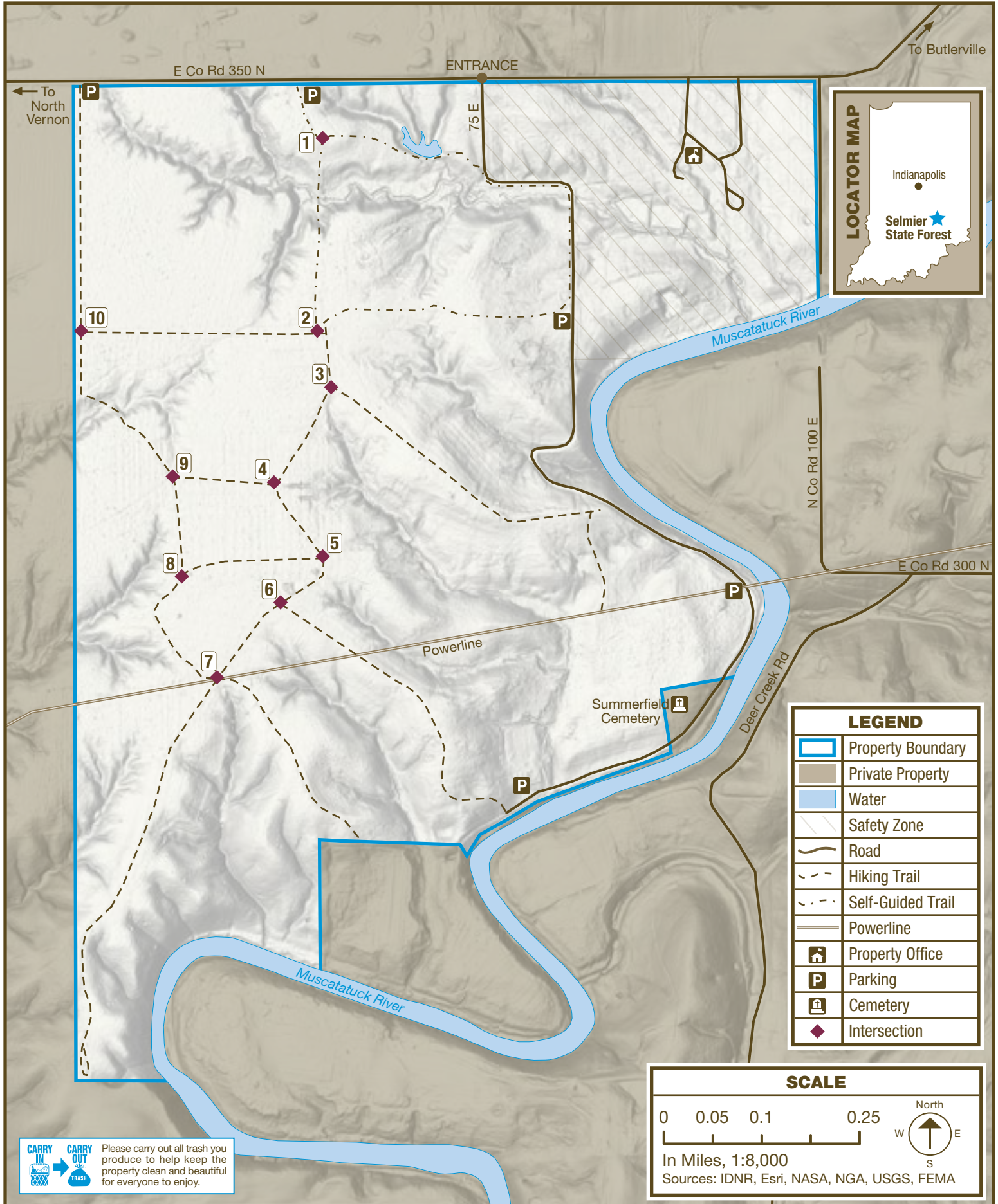
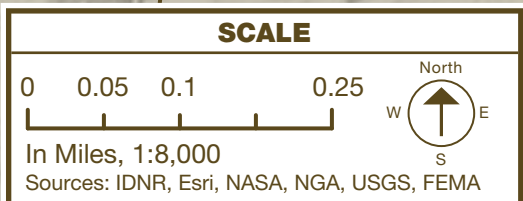

RULES GOVERNING USE

Public lands are managed for the long-term use of our citizens. To protect these lands and assure their ability to provide multiple benefits forever, certain activities are prohibited, including use off-road motorized vehicles, carelessness with fires, destruction of private or public property, unauthorized vegetation or fauna destruction, and unauthorized trail-making. Hunting and shooting is prohibited within 400 feet of recreation areas and across any roadway or trail. Please take care of your public lands and enjoy them.

Please let wild animals remain wild.

Feeding wildlife is prohibited. Feeding of wild animals can result in harm to both animals and people. Animals who depend on handouts become a nuisance to visitors and a danger to themselves. Please lock up all food and coolers inside cars or campers. Roll up car windows tightly.

HELP PREVENT WILDFIRES

- Build fires only in designated areas.
- Be sure to properly dispose of all smoking materials.
- Report any violation of fire regulations to property officials at once.
- Leave only footprints. Take only memories.

Selmier State Forest is two miles northeast of North Vernon on County Road 350 North. There are 355 acres of multi-use woods with hiking trails and access to the Muscatatuck River. The property is open daily, sunrise to sunset.

Selmier State Forest was donated to the State of Indiana by Stella Selmier on behalf of her late husband, Frank, who had a strong interest in the outdoors. He planted several acres of pine, black locust, black walnut, sycamore, and tulip tree on this property from 1921 to 1934. Most of the property was placed in Indiana's Classified Forest Program before it became state land in 1944.

ACTIVITIES AND FACILITIES

There are no public restrooms, camping, picnicking, swimming, horse trails or boat launching facilities. Nearby camping is available at Versailles State Park and Muscatatuck County Park.

FISHING—Fishing and access to the Muscatatuck River are available from the forest; species of fish include largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, bluegill, perch, and catfish. A valid Indiana fishing license is required.

HIKING—There is a network of trails from which to enjoy Selmier State Forest. Intersection markers have been installed in the interior to guide hikers. The power line corridor is not maintained as a trail, but can be hiked at the user's own risk. Hikers are advised to wear hunter orange or other bright clothing while on trails during hunting season.

The one-mile Self-Guided Forest Management Trail features tree identification, successional areas, and timber stand improvement practices. The trail forms a loop with parking lots to the northwest and southeast.

HUNTING—White-tailed deer, turkey, squirrel, and raccoon are available. A valid hunting license is required.
