In 2025 Indiana Conservation Officer's received 31 ginseng related complaints through our dispatch and documented 4 calls created by officers (which may have been a complaint received directly to them instead of through dispatch). 13 calls were coded as trespass or hunting without consent of landowner and 4 listed as unfounded.
Officers documented 32 violations:
13 for harvesting / possession of ginseng during closed season.
2 for harvesting illegal ginseng / quota violations.
17 for harvesting ginseng without landowner consent.

Annual Report of Indiana Ginseng Dealings:

2025-26 Harvest and Sale Season narrative

Indiana had ginseng harvested and certified as follows this year:

- 944 lbs. 5 oz wild dry and 26 lbs. 4 oz. wild simulated dry. This was purchased dry.
- Fresh wild ginseng harvested and purchased totaled 694 lbs. 3 oz. and was certified as 222 pound, 2 oz dry using .32 conversion rate. All fresh root was dried by the respective dealers (buyers) by the time of certification.
- For the first time this year, Indiana had wild simulated fresh weight harvested of 5 oz which was certified as 2 oz dry (.32 conversion rate).

- Indiana does not have artificially propagated ginseng harvested or certified.

Indiana had a total of 17 dealers and 1,186 harvesters this year. This represents our lowest year for harvesters, however the difference was only 6.

Based on comparison between years, the 2025 harvest has recovered in some counties. We believe this is primarily due to weather conditions. While we haven't compared the weather officially, we do know we had a somewhat wet and cooler spring followed by a normal dry summer and very dry early fall in 2025. While the number of harvesters is down just slightly, the harvest has rebounded in some counties. Sales were typical as the beginning of the season was extremely lively, slowing later, and prices per pound were typically low at the season start but higher later. The average price per pound was down just slightly this year to \$600.00 at mid-season point (October), which is \$8 lower than 2024.

FINDINGS:

Present abundance of wild ginseng rating was based on this scale:

0 = Absent	No Activity
1 = Rare	Under 1 lb.
3 = Frequent	Over 1 lb.

At the end of the 2025 harvest season, 23 Indiana counties reported no activity; of these, 21 reported an increase or decrease from last year in an amount to move to the next category. Most (68) counties reported a harvest of at least 1 oz. which is up 2 counties from last year.

Trend data requested in wild ginseng population considers the comparison of the 2024 harvest season and this current 2025 season:

-2 = extirpated	0 lbs. of wild ginseng harvested 2 years in a row
-1 = decreasing	decrease of more than 50 lbs. of wild ginseng since previous year
0 = stable	within 50 lbs. of previous harvest of wild ginseng
+1 = increasing	50 or more lbs. of wild ginseng harvested over last season

Except for extirpation, none of Indiana's 92 counties reported a negative trend in harvest, with all others showing a stable harvest. Eight (8) are up in enough quantities

to move to the next category. This year, 16 counties are showing extirpation for a period longer than 2 years: Adams, Benton, Blackford, Hamilton, Hendricks, Howard, Jasper, Jay, LaGrange, Marion, Newton, Randolph, Steuben, Tipton, Wells and White. Interestingly, 14 of the counties are in the Central Till Plain natural region. This is a natural region scraped away by glacial activity and is now extremely desirable agricultural area. Hamilton, Hendricks, Howard, and Marion are highly impacted by urban sprawl – especially large efforts such as warehouses and data centers. Interestingly, off the extirpation list this year are Bartholomew, Allen, Elkhart, Fulton, Grant, Lake, Shelby and Wabash.

Growing conditions continue to be the driving force behind the harvest figures and large habitat losses have hit hard in the counties around Indianapolis. Despite this, we do recommend continuing the harvest under the current rules and regulations. However, to help ensure those who violate Ginseng laws in other states are not able to do similar business with similar violations in Indiana, we strongly recommend the adoption of reciprocal suspension among the 19 Ginseng states, such as is already in place for hunting and fishing licenses.

License applications/payments/issuances were once again accomplished online with the same timelines since 2021. Indiana's Ginseng Dealers continue to be required to accomplish 100% of their submittals online and into the Ginseng Portal. Dealers may do this work via various platforms (mobile/smartphone, notebook, laptop or desktop computer) and the database behind it allows for single entry accomplished directly by dealers. Various reports, all certificates, annual reporting, etc. are pulled from the logged transactions, verified, electronically signed by dealers and certified by conservation officers online. Dealers are comfortable with using the portal based on continued reduction in questions, phone calls, system glitches that required resolution. In July 2025, the Indiana Division of Nature Preserves and the Division of Fish and Wildlife merged. The merger has had very little effect on the ginseng program to date. In February 2026, Indiana DNR introduced changes to Ginseng Law (IC 14-31-3) and rules (312 IAC 19) to incorporate the two into one law under IC 14-31-3, however the effort did not pass and will likely be attempted again in 2027. The goal is to reduce regulations and ensure conformity to other licensing practices in the state while requiring the information collection needed to comply with federal requirements. Changes may also include harvester license requirements. The dealer license fee will remain in code. Several items may be considered to provide consistency regarding enforcement.

With the 2027 ginseng season, the ginseng portal functions will be incorporated into Indiana's Customer Management System for licensing and permits, making ginseng part of a collaborative approach for all licenses and permits handled by the Division of Fish, Wildlife, and Nature Preserves. Work has already begun on this effort with the collaboration of Nature Preserves, Law Enforcement, Fish and Wildlife and others.

In conclusion, weather continues to be the greatest factor for fluctuations and change in the Indiana harvest of Ginseng.
