2023-2025 Title III Immigrant Influx Allocations

In accordance with Title III, Sec. 3114(d)(2), the IDOE provides a portion of the state Title III appropriation to support schools and districts that have experienced a significant influx of immigrant students. A local education agency is considered to have had a significant immigrant influx if it has experienced an increase of at least 50 immigrant students over the average immigrant population of the two preceding years, representing an increase in immigrant student population of at least 30%. Any local education agency (LEA) meeting these criteria is eligible to receive the Title III Immigrant Influx subgrant.

2023-2025 Title III Immigrant Influx Allocations

Each qualifying LEA listed below has been allocated a \$10,000 base grant and an additional allocation of \$28.00 per-pupil for each immigrant student reported in the 2022-2023 school year.

*These per-pupil allocations only account for those students at the public LEA. Nonpublic schools' students were included in calculating growth, however their per-pupil amounts won't be added to the LEA's final allocation unless the nonpublic school opts in to Title III. 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Allowable Activities:

As outlined in Title III, Section 3115(e)(1), school corporations shall utilize Title III Immigrant Influx funds for instructional activities which may include:

- Family literacy services, parent outreach, and training to support parents' active participation in their children's education
- Support for personnel, including paraprofessionals, to provide services to immigrants
- Provision of tutorials, mentoring, and academic or career counseling for immigrants
- Acquisition of curricular materials, educational software, and technologies for use in the program carried out with funds
- Basic instructional services directly attributable to the presence of immigrants (supplies, transportation)
- Other instructional services designed to support immigrant achievement (e.g., civics education, introduction to US educational system)
- Comprehensive community services in coordination with community-based organizations

Applying for Funding:

The Immigrant Influx subgrant of Title III acts as a separate grant from the general Title III allocation and grant application process. Immigrant Influx funding does follow the same timeline as the 2023-2025 Title III grant for application, amendments, and reporting. The application process consists of a Budget Table to submit within a Jotform.
