ILEARN Biology and U.S. Government End-of-Course Assessment (ECA) Spring 2023 Testing Window Closes Friday, May 19
The ILEARN Biology and U.S. Government ECA testing window closes Friday, May 19. Corporation Test Coordinators (CTCs) must ensure that the following tasks are completed:

- Ensure all students complete required testing within the Test Information Distribution Engine (TIDE).
- Return all used and unused materials to Data Recognition Corporation (DRC) by Friday, May 19, using guidance provided in the original shipment.

Listsers: IDOE's Office of Student Assessment sends weekly assessment updates on Monday morning to CTCs. CTCs should share these messages with all applicable staff.

ILEARN TEST OVERVIEW

ILEARN is Indiana's summative school accountability assessment for grades 3-8 and biology.

All students in grades 3-8 who do not qualify for the alternate assessment participate in their grade-level testing. The ILEARN Biology End-of-Course Assessment (ECA) is required upon completion of the high school biology course, and the optional U.S. Government ECA may be administered to students who have completed U.S. Government.

IREAD OVERVIEW



IREAD is a foundational reading assessment developed in accordance with Indiana legislation.

- Participation in IREAD fulfills a state requirement for grade three students; it provides data for grade 2 students' performance in reading capability.
- IREAD results provides schools with data to support interventions and remediation for students who have not yet achieved foundational reading skills.
- IREAD is required for all grade two and three students unless they passed during a grade two administration or participate in the alternate assessment.
- Grade three students (and above), who do not pass continue to participate in test administrations through grade 6 or until they obtain proficiency.

- IREAD is a multiple choice, untimed assessment consisting of three segments.
- IDOE does not recommend that students take all segments on the same day and breaks between segments are highly encouraged.
- Segment 1 will contain updates for the 2023-2024 administration regarding the delivery of items. Separate video presentations will be provided with more details in the near future.

IREAD RESULTS & REMEDIATION

Did Not Pass (Below 446)

Passing Score (446+)

Students who do not pass IREAD:

- Receive reading support from schools and targeted remediation.
- Continue to participate in retest opportunities in grade four, five, and six, if applicable.
- May be retained in the third grade if certain criteria are not met.
- May be granted a Good Cause Exemption (GCE) if specific criteria are met, which removes the retention requirement. Grade two students are not eligible for a GCE.

Students who pass IREAD-3:

- Meet the state requirement for reading proficiency and no longer participate in this assessment.

IREAD GRADE TWO PROCESS & RESULTS

Due to Senate Bill 1, schools are required to administer IREAD to grade two students as an early indicator of reading proficiency.

I AM OVERVIEW

I AM is the summative accountability assessment for students with significant cognitive disabilities.

I AM is Indiana's Alternate Measure. Only about 1% of students qualify to participate in I AM.

I AM Biology is required upon completion of the biology content connectors.

ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Alternate Assessment Criteria

Review of the student's record indicates a disability that significantly impacts intellectual functions and adaptive behavior. Adaptive behavior is defined as essential for someone to live independently and to function safely in daily life.


The student requires extensive, repeated, individualized direct instruction and substantial support that is not of a temporary nature.



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ALTERNATE ASSESSMENT PARTICIPATION GUIDANCE

A case conference committee (CCC) determination based on the identified participation criteria and the student's individual needs is used to determine whether a student with disabilities will participate with or without accommodations in the general education assessment(s) or Indiana's Alternate Measure (I AM) assessment.



I AM is based on the Alternate Indiana Academic Achievement Standards, known as Indiana Content Connectors. CCCs must be informed that the decision to participate in I AM means that the student will have limited modified exposure to the grade-level standards, which could result in a significant impact on the student's academic outcomes and post-secondary opportunities.

The student requires substantially adapted materials and individualized methods of accessing information in alternative ways to achieve measurable gains on the state academic content standards for the grade in which the student is enrolled.

I AM TEST DESIGN CONTINUED

I AM is a **stage-adaptive assessment**.

This means that participation in Part 1 determines placement into one of three forms for Part 2. Practice test items are embedded in the operational assessment.

Indiana funds the PSAT/NMSQT to measure students' college and career readiness, indicate student strengths and challenges, and provide additional student support and data. Scholarship opportunities are also available.

DIGITAL SAT SCHOOL DAY OVERVIEW

The **SAT** is Indiana's summative high school accountability assessment for grade 11 students.

CTCs will designate School Test Coordinators (STCs) to College Board to oversee school-specific testing.

CTCs must ensure that a Services for Students with Disabilities (SSD) Coordinator oversees required accommodations for the SAT administration.

Students will be registered for the SAT School Day by IDOE.

The SAT School Day assesses English/language arts and mathematics. Cohort 2026 students will participate in the spring of 2025.

What's Changing?

- One testing window instead of two testing windows. Make sure to test students early in the window!
- Same set up as last school year: State Data Management System (SDMS), SSD Online, TDTK, and Bluebook

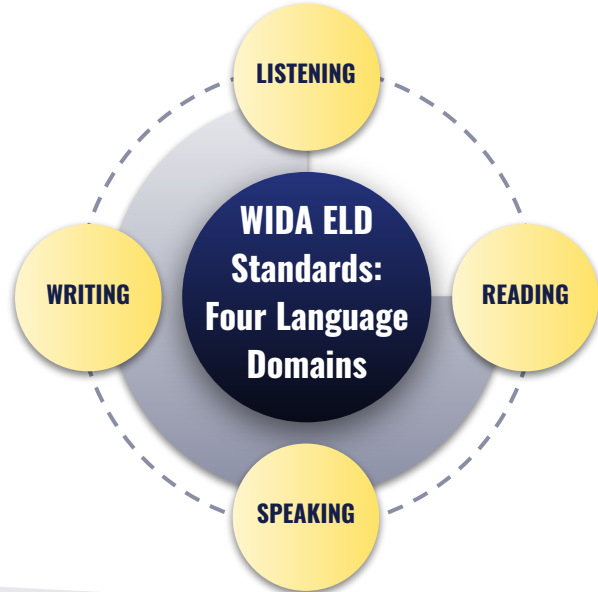

WIDA OVERVIEW

WIDA provide Indiana's English language proficiency placement and annual assessments.



WIDA Screener assessments are used to identify and inform initial programmatic placement of English learners (ELs).

WIDA ACCESS summative assessments are administered annually to determine ELs' current levels of English proficiency and to monitor student progress. It is federally required that 100% of identified EL students participate.

IDENTIFICATION

Entrance Criteria: A potential EL student who scores below 5.0 on Screener is formally identified as an EL.

PLACEMENT

Screener results determine a student's placement in the EL program and inform instructional services.

PROGRESS

ACCESS results are utilized to support decisions about instructional planning and show the progress of ELs annually.

ACHIEVEMENT

Exit Criteria: An EL who meets exit criteria on ACCESS is reclassified as fluent and enters two-year monitoring period.

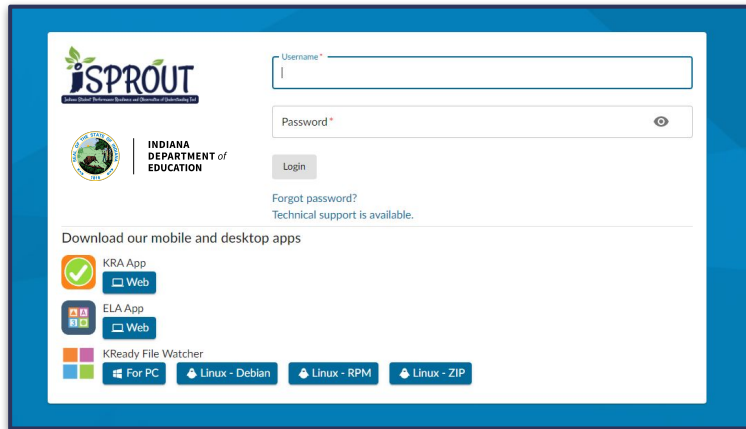

ISPROUT is an observational tool aligned to the Indiana Early Learning Standards for student developmental reporting, artifact archival, and meeting/planning assistance.



IKRA OVERVIEW

IKRA is Indiana's assessment tool administered at the beginning of the school year that allows teachers to measure each child's school readiness across multiple domains.

IKRA utilizes observation and direct performance to measure a child's school readiness across four domains: language and literacy, mathematics, social foundations, and physical well-being and motor development.

NAEP is a congressionally-mandated project, and participation is required for schools receiving Title 1 funding.

NAEP provides results on student achievement, instructional experiences, and environmental factors.

Because Indiana receives Title I funding for certain student populations, federal law requires the administration of NAEP in selected Indiana schools.

UNIVERSAL SCREENER OVERVIEW

The universal screener is required for K-2 students to identify learning characteristics related to dyslexia.

Administration of the universal screener for learning characteristics related to dyslexia is required in kindergarten through grade two within the first 90 calendar days of school.

If students are flagged as 'at risk' or 'at some risk,' schools immediately provide intervention and request parental consent to administer a diagnostic assessment within the first 90 calendar days of school to further inform that intervention.

Only approved screeners and diagnostic assessments may be used for these purposes.

CTC Test Security & Integrity Training

- Complete the recorded 2024-2025 CTC Test Security & Integrity Training in Moodle;
- Pass the CTC Test Security & Integrity Training Quiz in Moodle; and
- Sign the 2024-2025 Indiana Testing Security & Integrity Agreement.

STC Test Security & Integrity Training

- Use information from the CTC Test Security & Integrity Training to train STCs; and
- Ensure STCs sign the 2024-2025 Indiana Testing Security & Integrity Agreement; and
- Maintain training documentation (attendance sign-in sheets, agendas, presentations, etc.) on file at the local level.

All Staff Test Security & Integrity Training

- Use IDOE's recorded All Staff Test Security & Integrity Training found in the Test Coordinator Corner in Moodle to train all staff;
- Use information from IDOE's recorded All Staff Test Security & Integrity Training to supplement/develop local policy and guidance for staff; and
- Ensure all school staff sign the 2024-20245 Indiana Testing Security and Integrity Agreement.

All test security training must be completed annually by September 30.

IDOE Accommodation Training	Required for all CTCs, STCs, and TAs administering assessments to students with accommodations.	Prior to test administration.
CAI Test Administration Certification/Training	Required certification for I AM, ILEARN, and IREAD TAs.	Prior to test administration.
College Board SAT Training	Required for STCs, proctors, and supporting staff.	Prior to SAT administration.
WIDA Assessments Training	Required for CTCs, Additional Members, WIDA Test Coordinators, and WIDA TAs.	Prior to WIDA assessment administrations.
ISPROUT Training	Required for staff supporting ISPROUT and data managers.	Prior to accessing ISPROUT.

**Test security training must be given to all new staff throughout the school year. A refresher training is required prior to each assessment window.*
