As we approach the filing deadline on Tuesday, April 15, thank you in advance to the many high school teachers, counselors, and school leaders who share reminders and help connect students and families with the resources they need to complete the application. IDOE's Office of Special Education is updating its monitoring procedures for local educational agencies (LEAs) due to changes in federal guidance. Effective immediately, IDOE will shift to a new monitoring schedule where approximately 70 LEAs will be reviewed annually. The monitoring cycle will follow a six-year cohort schedule, with adjustments based on an annual risk assessment. Each LEA will be monitored at least once during this six-year cycle. All LEAs will be monitored annually through a
