

The following can be found on the Claims Information and Instructions document: SFAs that have contracted with Food Service Management Companies (FSMCs) must retain signature authority on claims within CNPweb. Therefore, FSMC and vendor employees must not be responsible for or have access to submit claims in CNPweb. The SFA employee responsible for submitting claims in CNPweb must be designated on the Responsibility Contact Form each year and submitted to IDOE as part of your FSMC Contract award or renewal.


