Federal regulations require state agencies to contribute state matching funds to school food authorities (SFAs) on the National School Lunch Program. USDA calculates the amount states must distribute, and states choose how it is distributed among schools.

Indiana distributes the match requirement based on the paid meals (fair share based on the number of

USDA Foods Direct Delivery "Order By" Reminder As a reminder, schools must place USDA Foods Direct Delivery (Brown Box) orders in CNPweb by

10 a.m. ET the Monday of the week prior to the delivery period that your school would like to receive the delivery. Due to a system glitch, CNPweb has been allowing schools to place orders past this deadline. IDOE is working to fix this issue. However, any orders or edits after the 10 a.m. ET deadline cannot be honored and could result in an extreme delay in receiving the order. After the


