Reminder: Per federal law, only School Food Authority (SFA) employees can have edit access to FDP. Food Service Management Company (FSMC) employees can only have view access in CNPweb.

Sponsor-level accounts are CNPweb accounts with a login ID that is just the school corporation

number (such as 5390 or K199). Most sponsors have a sponsor-level account still active in CNPweb. These accounts were the standard login ID prior to the switch to single user accounts in 2022. Sponsor-level accounts currently only have access to the Food Distribution Program (FDP), and the access for this login has been changed to View Only. If a single user account needs access to FDP, the

Early next year, the Food Distribution Program (FDP) will move from the CNPweb system to

PrimeroEdge. The tentative roll out will be in mid to late January 2026, beginning with the annual pre-order forecast survey. IDOE will provide more details and training information as we get closer to the roll out period. Is Your School Ready for a Recall? If recall does impact USDA Foods, find, isolate, and label the food with Do Not Use labels.


