The 2025 School Tech Plan Survey is now available to be completed for all Indiana school corporations, charter schools, and non-public schools. The survey will be open through Friday, April 18. Completion of this survey is a requirement for all public schools to qualify for the connectivity formula grant, the common school fund, and grants from IDOE's Office of Academics. While not required, non-public schools are encouraged to complete the survey to help other schools identify best practices. The survey can be completed here. The LINK Portal's Identity Server has been upgraded to the latest version in order to support the newest version of .NET. This technology allows IDOE to recognize local Google or Microsoft login credentials. This upgrade requires new tokens for many of the applications that are linked within the LINK Portal to be refreshed. While some users will not experience any issues, others

will need to clear their browser's cache and re-authenticate in order for their applications to function properly. Contact

REMINDER: Embargoed Student Fee Study Now Available to School Leaders The statutorily required (IC 20-40-22-8(d)) student fee data is now available for review by school leaders. Schools submitted this data in fall 2024 in response to a set of questions about fees charged to families for activities during the school day. All schools were required to respond to the survey in order to receive a distribution from the curricular materials fund. The dashboard is available through the EdData platform in the <u>Link Portal</u> for school leaders at the school and corporation levels. Contact IDOE's Office of School Finance with any questions. IDOE is once again participating in the E-Rate Match Program for special fiber construction projects. Available to any Indiana public school for fiscal year (FY) 2025 (July 1, 2025, to June 30, 2026), the program increases the discount rate for special construction charges for high-speed broadband that meets the Federal Communications Commission's (FCC's) long-term connectivity targets up to an additional 10% to match the state funding on a one-to-one dollar basis. NEW: Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) Part B Annual State Application All states applying for funding under IDEA Part B are required to allow public review and comment on the application and proposed budget. The application, developed by the U.S. Department of Education's Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) includes a summary of assurances, certifications, and fund usage descriptions that Indiana will use to fulfill IDEA Part B requirements. Access the application on IDOE's special education webpage for review, and feedback may be submitted Public Comment for Part B through Monday, April 21. Upon OSEP's approval of Indiana's Part B application, the state will receive a federal grant award to implement necessary services for students with disabilities for July 1, 2025, through September 30, 2027. IDOE's Office of Special Education is updating its monitoring procedures for local educational agencies (LEAs) due to changes in federal guidance. Effective immediately, IDOE will shift to a new monitoring schedule where approximately 70 LEAs will be reviewed annually. The monitoring cycle will follow a six-year cohort schedule, with adjustments based on an annual risk assessment. Each LEA will be monitored at least once during this six-year cycle. All LEAs will be monitored annually through a
