Beware of a Text Message Scam

A renewed text message scam requesting confirmation of bank account information for tax refund deposits is circulating again. For the record, DOR will never send a text message asking for any payment information.

If you receive a text message claiming to be from DOR:

- Do not click any links or respond to suspicious texts.
- Do not share personal or financial information (i.e., banking information, driver's license number, Social Security number, or credit card details).
- Do not reply to the message.
- Contact DOR at 317-232-2240, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. ET.

If you think you have been a victim of this text message scam:

- Immediately change your passwords for any accounts that may have been compromised.
- Contact your bank or financial institution to report the incident and take necessary steps to protect your accounts by freezing or monitoring for suspicious activity.
- Place a fraud alert or credit freeze on your credit file with all three credit bureaus.
- Monitor activity on your accounts.
- Report confirmed cases of identity theft to the [Federal Trade Commission](#).

INTIME Updates Reminder

INTIME allows customers to respond to a letter, notice, or bill as a non-logged-in user with their letter ID when accessing the "Respond to correspondence" panel. More information is available in the [INTIME Quick Guide](#).

A joint view for period-level letters, notices, or bills for spouses that live at the same address during the filing period has also been created. This means that spouses will be able to view and respond to these types of letters using their own INTIME account. A spouse who becomes separated will only be able to access, view, and respond to any letters that were sent during their joint filings. All access and visibility to any future letters will be lost once their address and joint status has changed in INTIME.
