SUBJECT: Curb Ramp Design Reminders

On behalf of the INDOT ADA Technical Advisory Committee, this memo is to bring to your attention a few frequently missed details related to curb ramp and sidewalk design. Designers should become familiar with the design and plan requirements contained in *Indiana Design Manual* section 51-1.0, Accessibility.

- <u>Preferred slopes are to be used for design</u>. For example, cross slopes should be designed for 1.5%, not the maximum of 2.0%
- The counter slope should be detailed. Where the rate of change between the counter slope and the ramp running slope exceeds 11% a 2-ft level area should be provided.
- Pedestrian pushbutton location should be considered when locating and designing a curb ramp. Side reach, mounting height, and presence of a compliant pedestrian pushbutton clear space are essential for achieving an accessible facility.

Where a curb ramp design element does not meet the criteria set by the *Public Rights-of-Way Accessibility Guidelines* (PROWAG) or the Department, a technical inquiry or determination of technical infeasibility should be submitted to the ADA Technical Advisory Committee in accordance with *Indiana Design Manual* 40-8.04(01) item 3. This includes, but is not limited to, where a preferred slope cannot be met or a pedestrian pushbutton cannot be made accessible.
