EFFECTIVE:	Hydraulic Submittals on or after July 1, 2018

The Department has updated the Office of Hydraulics responsibilities for LPA projects on locally owned, non-NHS routes. The following guidance now applies.

## LPA Project on a Locally Owned, Non-NHS Route

- Pipes/Small Culverts (span < 4ft). The Office of Hydraulics will not review these structures.
- Bridges (span > 20 ft) and Small Structures/Large Culverts (span ≥ 4 ft and ≤ 20 ft). Review and approval by the Office of Hydraulics is required when any one or more of the following conditions are met.
  - 1. The structure is one mile or less downstream of an INDOT structure (measured along the stream).
  - 2. The proposed backwater does not dissipate before reaching an upstream INDOT structure.
  - 3. The structure is 1/2 mile or less upstream of an INDOT structure (measured along the stream).
  - 4. There are levees within the proposed project limits.
- Storm Drains. Review and approval by the Office of Hydraulics is required when one or more of the following conditions are met.
  - 1. Where any drainage from the LPA project is received by INDOT right of way.
  - 2. Where any drainage from INDOT right of way is received by the LPA system.

• Detention. Review and approval by the Office of Hydraulics is required when drainage is received by INDOT right of way.

The above guidance applies only to an LPA project on a locally owned, non-NHS route. Review and approval by the Office of Hydraulics is required in all cases for a project on a State routes and for a project on an NHS local route.
