

EXPLORING BENEFITS

Indiana Women **Veterans Program**



- Women made up 17.3% of the active-duty force and 21.4% of the National Guard and reserves in 2021.
- Women comprised 9.4% of the total Veteran population in the United States in 2015, and are projected to make up 16.3% by 2043.
- The total population of women Veterans is expected to increase at an average rate of about 18,000 women per year for the next 10 years.
- In 2015, 23.4% of all women Veterans were divorced compared with 12.6% of non-Veteran women.
- Overall, women Veterans were less likely than non-Veteran women to be living in poverty in 2015. About 10% of all women Veterans and 15% of all non-Veteran women had incomes below the poverty

Indiana is home to over 33,000 women veterans, who have served in every war period, including World War II. Notably, 1,087 of these women are military retirees. As of November 30, 2011, there were 2,335 women on active duty, excluding those serving in the Indiana National Guard or Reserve units.

Despite their service, many women veterans are unaware of the benefits and services available to them. This section aims to bridge that gap by providing valuable resources for women veterans and their communities. We've compiled a comprehensive list of federal benefits and services offered through the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, as well as state-specific benefits and facilities available to Indiana residents. Additionally, we've included local resources in Indiana communities that may be of interest to all women.

ROLL CALL

The Indiana Veterans Memorial Cemetery is dedicated to Veterans and their families as a lasting memorial, and final resting place, in appreciation and gratitude for their service and sacrifice to our nation.

To be eligible for burial:

- The veteran must have been separated under conditions other than dishonorable
- If Guard or Reserve, must have been eligible for retirement pay at the time of death
- · Servicemember who died while serving on active duty
- The surviving spouse of an eligible veteran or
- A child under the age of 21 of an eligible veteran.
