



Building a Legacy: Honoring Veterans' Leaders with Bricks on Monument Circle



As 2025 begins, the Indiana Department of Veterans Affairs (IDVA) reflects on a remarkable 2024, highlighted by the honor of hosting the National Association of State Directors of Veterans Affairs (NASDVA) conference in Indianapolis.

This event brought together state veteran affairs directors from all states and territories, supporting our nation's veterans through collaboration and innovation. Topics ranged from mental health support and housing solutions to workforce development and access to healthcare. The IDVA team embraced this honor to host the conference and approached the opportunity with vision by coordinating two other conferences with NASDVA.

For the first time in its history, the NASDVA 2024 summer conference was held in conjunction with the National Association of State Women Veteran Coordinators. This provided integrated sessions and networking opportunities for state directors and women veteran coordinators. IDVA also partnered with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Administration to host a two-day Governor's Challenge to Prevent Suicide conference. Hosting these three events simultaneously provided for unprecedented collaboration.

"Hosting this conference was an incredible honor for Indiana," said Joe DeVito, Outreach Director of IDVA. "It gave us the opportunity to showcase our dedication to veterans while learning from the extraordinary work happening across the country."

A highlight of the conference was the NASDVA President's Dinner at the Indiana War Memorial, followed with a special ceremony at Monument Circle. As a lasting tribute, each state director was honored with a personalized brick placed on the Circle. These bricks, now part of the fabric of this historic site, symbolize the commitment of these leaders to the well-being of our nation's veterans.







The brick reveal ceremony was a surprise for the directors and was a poignant moment. Attendees shared heartfelt stories and reflected on the unity that defines their work.

"The ceremony at the Soldiers & Sailors Memorial was moving and the bricks were absolutely an honor. Class act!" said one state director.

"The bricks made me cry in public, which is gross, but were so very thoughtful," joked another state director.

The bricks on Monument Circle are a powerful reminder of what is being achieved with states veteran affairs agencies coming together in service to veterans.

Hosting the NASDVA conference showcased Indiana's dedication to our veterans and provided a national platform for IDVAs innovative approach. Honoring our state and territory veterans affairs directors' contributions here in Indiana creates lasting tribute marked a year of pride and purpose. At Ease Orchard was selected to serve as the agency's Non-Profit Partner (NPP) in 2025. The program partners IDVA with an Indiana non-profit dedicated to enhancing the lives of Indiana's Veterans.



At Ease Orchard was founded by Army veteran Joe Ricker and is dedicated to empowering veterans and their families through suMsteanitnaal bHlee aaltghr iAcumIteurriec aa nofd beekeeping. Located in northeastern

Hancock County, the organization offers hands-on training, educational resources, and a supportive community to help veterans find purpose and healing in farming. Their programs, such as the VetFarm Network and Beekeeping for Heroes, aim to improve social connections, strengthen physical health, and reduce symptoms of depression and PTSD among participants. connections, strengthen physical health, and reduce symptoms of depression and PTSD among participants.

Together, IDVA and At Ease Orchard will plan the annual IDVA golf outing as well as other community events throughout the year to raise funds for At Ease Orchard's mission; raise awareness of state and federal benefits available to veterans; and foster community, camaraderie, and connection.
