Workers from Krizman International, Inc. in Mishawaka eligible for federal aid

INDIANAPOLIS (November 9, 2007) – The Indiana Department of Workforce Development today announced a ruling by the U.S. Department of Labor that former employees of Krizman International, Inc. in Mishawaka are eligible to receive services under the federal Trade Adjustment Assistance program. The ruling also extends to on-site leased workers of Manpower and Spherion of Mishawaka.

The TAA program, which is administered at the state level by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development, is made available to workers who are displaced due to foreign imports or shifts in production out of the country.

The federal ruling was issued on November 1, 2007 and applies to workers who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after October 18, 2006, and extends through November 1, 2009. The investigation was initiated on October 22, 2007, in response to a petition filed by a company official on behalf of workers of the facility. The workers are engaged in the production of automotive chassis parts (i.e. ball joints, tie rods, idler arms, pitman arms, and center links).

Additionally, the Department of Labor issued a certification for alternative trade adjustment assistance (ATAA) for separated older workers at the company. It was found that a significant number of workers at the company age 50 or over possess skills that are not easily transferable and that competitive conditions within the industry are adverse. Older workers may choose between regular TAA benefits or a wage subsidy of 50% of the difference between their new salary and old salary, up to \$10,000

The TAA program provides a variety of benefits and services to help unemployed workers prepare for and obtain suitable employment. Workers may be eligible for a variety of re-employment services, job search and relocation allowances and training. In addition, weekly trade re-adjustment allowances may be payable to eligible workers following the exhaustion of unemployment insurance benefits.
