### **Workers from GEA Bloomington Productions Operations eligible for federal aid**

INDIANAPOLIS (May 23, 2008) – The Indiana Department of Workforce Development today announced a ruling by the U.S. Department of Labor that former employees of GEA Bloomington Production Operations, LLC, a subsidiary of General Electric, including on-site leased workers of Securitas, 4M, Indiana Voice & Data and AVI Bloomington are eligible to receive services under the federal Trade Adjustment Assistance program.

The TAA program, which is administered at the state level by the Indiana Department of Workforce Development, is made available to workers who are displaced due to foreign imports or shifts in production out of the country.

The federal ruling was issued on May 12, 2008 and applies to workers who became totally or partially separated from employment on or after April 3, 2007 through May 12, 2010 are eligible to apply for TAA assistance. The investigation was initiated on April 7, 2008, in response to a petition filed on behalf of workers of the facility. The workers are engaged in the production of side-by-side refrigerators. The investigation revealed that the sales, production and employment declined during the relevant period of 2006, 2007 and January through March 2008 over the corresponding 2007 period. An increased reliance on imports of side-by-side refrigerators took place during this time period.

Additionally, the Department of Labor issued a certification for alternative trade adjustment assistance (ATAA) for separated older workers at GEA Bloomington. It was found that a significant number of workers at the company age 50 or over possess skills that are not easily transferable and that competitive conditions within the industry are adverse. Older workers may choose between regular TAA benefits or a wage subsidy of 50% of the difference between their new salary and old salary, up to \$10,000.

The TAA program provides a variety of benefits and services to help unemployed workers prepare for and obtain suitable employment. Workers may be eligible for a variety of re-employment services, job search and relocation allowances and training. In addition, weekly trade re-adjustment allowances may be payable to eligible workers following the exhaustion of unemployment insurance benefits.
