Dear Ms. Long:

This notice is being provided to you pursuant to the Worker Adjustment and Retraining Notification Act of 1988, which requires employers to give official notice to the state Dislocated Worker Unit and the chief elected official of local government in the case of a mass layoff.

Unfortunately, Indiana University will be permanently closing the Indiana University Cyclotron Operations ("IUCO") facility located at 2401 N. Milo B. Sampson Lane, Bloomington, IN 47408. Because IU and the Indiana University Health Proton Therapy Center ("IUHPTC") consider patient care to be the most critical consideration in this matter, the exact date of the closing and corresponding layoffs is not certain at this time, but will occur no sooner than 90 days from the date of this letter, and may occur as late as January 1, 2015. We expect to confirm the exact date of closing by August 31, 2014. The entire facility will be closed and all IUCO employees will be laid off, affecting a total of approximately 120 IU and IUHPTC employees.
