

Rules and Guidelines: Provisional Interpreters

Timeline:

APPROVAL

- You have 5 years to become certified
- Go to workshops to get CEUs as you need to submit 2.0 every year

YEAR TWO

- Renew your provisional standing - this is required every 2 years.
- Don't forget to submit your CEUs!

YEAR FOUR

- Renew your provisional standing - this is required every 2 years.
- Don't forget to submit your CEUs!

YEAR ONE

- Submit your 2.0 CEUs by emailing DHHSHelp@fssa.in.gov
- If you need help finding CEUs, reach out and we can help!

YEAR THREE

- Submit your 2.0 CEUs by emailing DHHSHelp@fssa.in.gov
- If you need help finding CEUs, reach out and we can help!

YEAR FIVE

- Submit proof of certification to us or proof of an application to the CASLI test for an extension.
- CEUs are also due at this time.

REMEMBER!

- Every year, you must submit CEUS
- Every two years, you must renew
- Five years is the length of your provisional status
