 - a. The meeting was called to order by Marc Ruiz.

- II. Approval of the March 8, 2024, meeting minutes
 - a) The Commission voted unanimously in favor
- III. Public Comment
 - a) There were no members of the public who made comment
- IV. BRS Director's Update Theresa Koleszar
 - a) Order of Selection Update
 - The division shall provide the council with a quarterly report containing the following information relating to vocational rehabilitation services:
 - 1. A status report of the division's effort to fill vocational counselor vacancies.
 - a. As of April 10, 2024:
 - i. 200 VR Counselor positions
 - 1. 10 vacant positions (5% of VRC positions); proceeding to fill all 10
 - 2. 16 staff in Trainee VRC status (8% of VRC positions)
 - 2. A status report of the order of selection.
 - a. As of April 10, 2024:



- i. Categories 1 & 2 OPEN; Category 3 CLOSED
- ii. 98% of eligible individuals met criteria for category 1/MSD or 2/SD during current SFY
- iii. 13 releases to date, with 3967 moving off waitlist
 - 1. 26% served or in services
 - a. 21% of those served/in services exited with employment
 - 2. 4% in process of contacting
 - 3. 21% declined services
 - 4. 36% unable to be located/didn't respond to outreach attempts
 - 5. 13% closed for other reasons
- iv. Priority category 2 opened July 2023 no waiting period
- v. Priority category 3 releases began October 2023
- vi. Priority category 3 targeted to 'open' by end of CY 2024 which will end OOS
- 3. The number of individuals who submitted applications for vocational rehabilitation services.
 - a. 4201 new VR applicants SFY24 through 3/31/24 (3/4 way through year projecting 10% increase from prior SFY)
 - b. 5208 new VR applicants in SFY23 (10% increase)
 - c. 4740 new VR applicants in SFY22
 - d. 3302 new Pre-ETS applicants SFY24 through 3/31/24
 - e. 3830 new Pre-ETS applicants in SFY23 (1.3% increase)
 - f. 3769 new Pre-ETS applicants in SFY22
- 4. The number of individuals who are currently on a wait list to obtain vocational rehabilitation services.
 - a. As of May 2, 2024, 415 on wait list
 - i. All in priority category 3
 - ii. 90 of these individuals new to wait list since 7/1/23
- 5. The number of individuals who are currently receiving vocational rehabilitation services (have an IPE).
 - a. May 2, 2024 'snapshot' 10,149 (9,457 November 2023 update 7% increase)
 - i. Number currently receiving services fluctuates daily.
 - ii. Snapshot captures individuals served as of a single point in time, rather than over the course of a year or other time period.
 - b. Total served SFY23 12,660 (SFY22 12,150)
 - i. 4% increase from SFY22 to SFY23
- b) VR Draft Rules
 - Updates:



- 1. Public comment period closed April 22nd, 2024
- 2. Reviewing comments and potential revisions to draft Rules
- 3. Overall positive feedback on enhanced vendor requirements
- 4. Second comment period later this year
- Goals for new rule:
 - 1. To align with WIOA requirements Pre-ETS, youth extended services
 - 2. To address practices implemented following previous federal monitoring and state audits vendor registration/vendor rule
 - 3. To improve clarity and organization
- c) Comprehensive Statewide Needs Assessment Update
 - Survey to VR participants released 1,025 responses so far
 - Survey to VR staff 67 responses so far
 - Collaborating with Self Advocates of IN on participant focus groups
 - 1. SAI reps will serve as moderators
 - 2. SAI moderators will receive training to promote an effective and uniform process
- d) Go IN BRS!
 - VR Training Director served on a panel at national VR conference in April on Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Accessibility efforts in IN.
 - BRS Director served on a panel with MN and OK to share successes with VR staff retention and recruitment for a national webinar in April.
 - BRS Director appointed as Chair of national VR Performance and Accountability Committee (previously co-chair)
 - 1. Committee focus VR provider/vendor capacity
 - 2. National provider capacity and training survey
 - RSA 'shout out' at national conference in April that IN VR was the only program with 0 monitoring findings.

 - VR Vendor webpage
 - VR Vendor Manual walk through
 - VR Employment Services webpage
 - VR Provider Directory
