Why are the Division’s numbers different from those provided by the community mental health center?

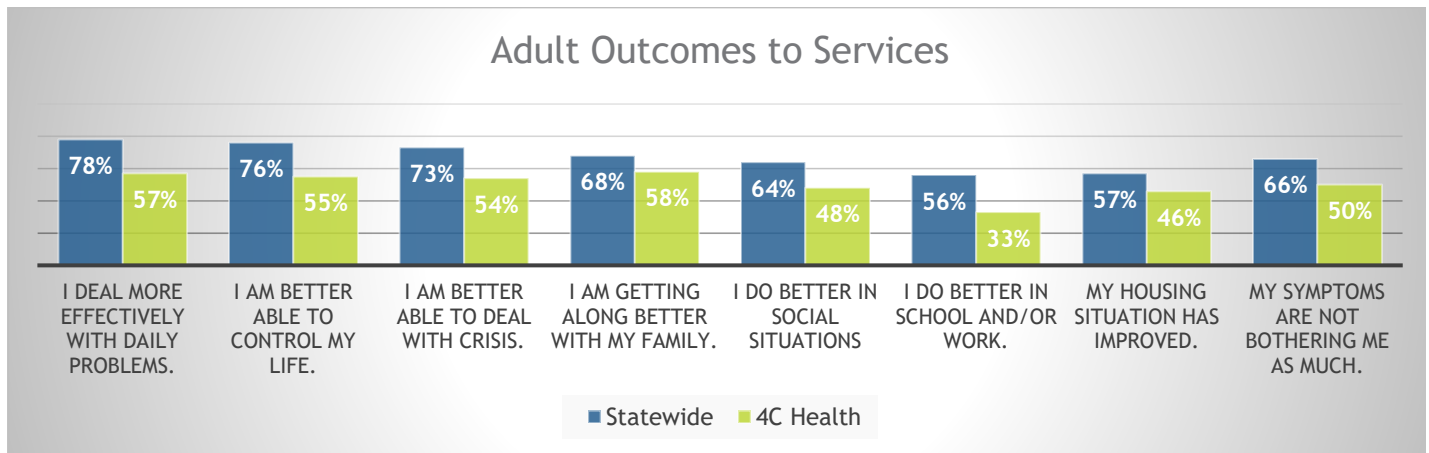
Community Mental Health Centers only submitted data to the Division for those individuals that meet the Division’s income eligibility and diagnostic criteria.



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Outcome Data

The Mental Health Statistics Improvement Program (MHSIP) survey is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of adults receiving services. Online electronic surveys, via Survey Monkey, were created for each organization with a unique link code for caregivers to access and complete the survey. Each organization was asked to choose at least one week to conduct surveys between August 28 and September 22, 2023; 127 surveys were completed. Surveys were completed anonymously. Below are the questions asked regarding outcomes of services.



The Youth Services Survey for Families (YSS-F) is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of parents of youth receiving services. Online electronic surveys, via Survey Monkey, were created for each organization with a unique link code for caregivers to access and complete the survey. Each organization was asked to choose at least one week to conduct surveys between August 28 and September 22, 2023; 80 surveys were completed. Surveys were completed anonymously. Below are the questions asked regarding outcomes of services.
