Madison State Hospital (MSH) celebrated its Centennial Anniversary in August 2010.

The Center for Medicare and Medicaid (CMS) Certified and The Joint Commission Accredited hospital moved into its state-of-the-art treatment facility in 2005. Overlooking the Ohio River, the design blended historic restoration, renovation, and new construction. With the exceptional natural lighting, personal space, and energy efficiency, MSH was one of the first psychiatric hospitals in the country to be certified for “Leadership in Environmental Energy Design”.

Since 2007, MSH has served in national leadership roles in the piloting and implementation of The Joint Commission’s new Core Measures for inpatient psychiatric hospitals which will become effective in 2011. Additionally, the hospital has been a state and national leader in healthcare technology, evidenced based clinical practices, reduction of staff overtime, and reduction in the use of polypharmacy.

The 150-bed facility serves adults who struggle with the most severe mental health challenges. Every patient works with a specialty trained psychiatric physician who leads a multi-disciplinary team of licensed nurses, psychologists, social workers, rehabilitation therapists, and behavioral health recovery attendants. Consultation with other physicians and specialists are readily available. Unit names, such as Recovery Road, Healing Heights, and Success Road reflect Madison’s philosophy of recovery based psychiatric treatment.

- **Adult Psychiatric Services:** 90 Beds.
 - Harmony Lane – 15 Bed Unit for males with high acuity and persistent psychiatric care needs.
 - Healing Heights – 12 Bed Unit for individuals with a co-morbid high acuity psychiatric and medical care needs that are manageable in a free standing psychiatric hospital.
 - Journey Way – 15 Bed Unit for females with high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Success Road – 15 Bed Coed Unit for individuals with high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Recovery Road – 15 Bed Unit for adult males with high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Wisdom Way – 18 Bed Unit for geriatric individuals with high acuity psychiatric care needs.

- **Adult Mentally Retarded/Developmentally Disabled (MR/DD) Services:** 60 Beds.
 - Hope Trail – Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) – 15 Bed Coed Unit for individuals dually diagnosed with MR/DD and high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Progress Road – Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) – 15 Bed Coed Unit for individuals dually diagnosed with MR/DD and high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Serenity Way – 15 Bed Coed Unit for individuals that are dually diagnosed with MR/DD and high acuity psychiatric care needs.
 - Victory Lane – Intermediate Care Facility for the Mentally Retarded (ICF/MR) – 15 Bed Unit for males dually diagnosed with MR/DD and high acuity psychiatric care needs.
