### Why are the Division’s numbers different from those provided by the community mental health center?

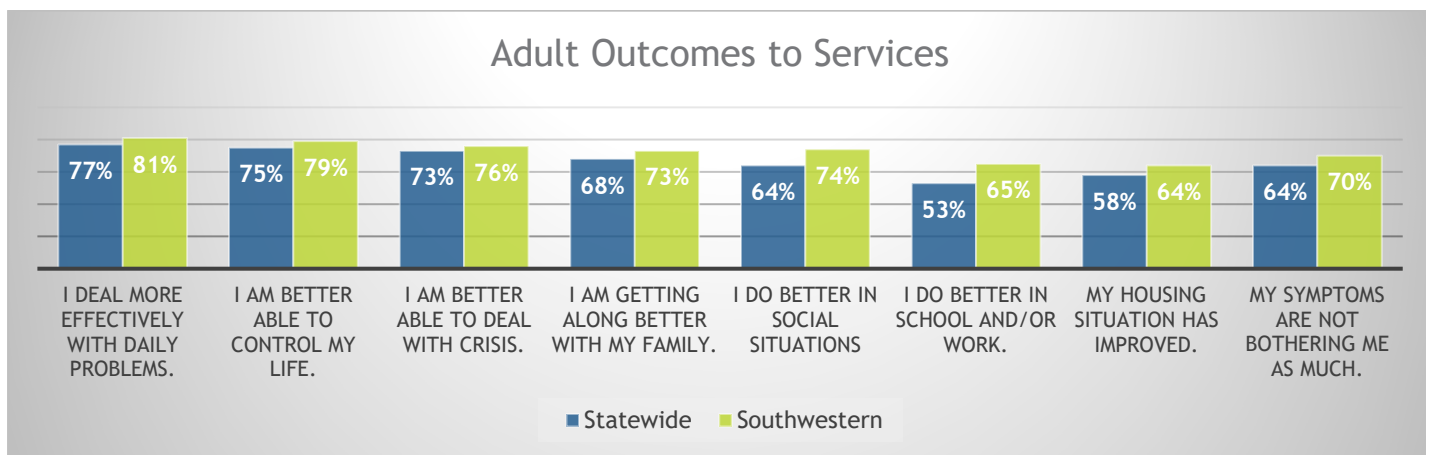
Community Mental Health Centers only submitted data to the Division for those individuals that meet the Division’s income eligibility and diagnostic criteria.



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## Outcome Data

The Mental Health Statistics Improvement Program (MHSIP) survey is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of adults receiving services. This survey was handed out to all individuals receiving services during at least a one-week period between August 30<sup>th</sup> and September 24<sup>th</sup> in 2021 for paper surveys and August 30<sup>th</sup> and October 8<sup>th</sup> for online surveys; 202 surveys were completed. Surveys were completed anonymously. Below are the questions asked regarding outcomes of services.



The Youth Services Survey for Families (YSS-F) is a nationally used survey and measures satisfaction of parents of youth receiving services. This survey was handed out to all individuals receiving services during at least a one-week period between August 30<sup>th</sup> and September 24<sup>th</sup> in 2021 for paper surveys and August 30<sup>th</sup> and October 8<sup>th</sup> for online surveys; 170 surveys were completed.
