### **State officials to Host “Healthy Indiana Plan” Expansion Talk in Avon**

Danville - Officials from Governor Mike Pence’s administration will be in Avon on Monday, June 9, from 11 a.m. until 12:30 p.m., to host a public forum detailing the Governor’s proposal to expand the Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP). The projected plan will extend health insurance coverage to approximately 350,000 uninsured Hoosiers. The public forum will take place in conference rooms 1 and 2 at the Hendricks Regional Health YMCA, 301 Satori Parkway. This conversation about the future of healthcare in Indiana will feature guest speaker Debra Minott, Family and Social Services Administration Secretary. The other presenter includes Allison Wharry from Hendricks Regional Health.

Recently, Governor Pence announced his plans to advance private, market-based Medicaid reforms in Indiana by expanding the current Healthy Indiana Plan. Pence unveiled [HIP 2.0](#), a consumer-driven health care coverage program for low-income adults that builds on Indiana’s history of consumer-driven health care while providing new incentives for members to take personal responsibility for their health.
