What is Program Integrity?

PI makes sure the money goes to the right <u>provider</u>, for the right <u>service</u>, for the right <u>member</u>, at the right <u>amount</u>, at the right <u>time</u>







Why is there Program Integrity?



- 42 CFR 455 Program Integrity: Medicaid
 - Authorizes a state fraud detection and investigation program within each state to monitor the Medicaid program
 - Requires the state plan to include requirements for identification, investigation, and referral of fraud and abuse
- 42 CFR 438 Managed Care (section 438.608)
 - Implements these requirements onto MCEs
- 42 CFR 456 Utilization Control: Subpart A and B

Why is there Program Integrity?

 - **12-15-13**
 - **12-15-13.5**
 - **12-15-23**

Indiana Administrative Code

- 405 IAC 1 (Member and Provider Services)
 - 405 IAC 1-1.4 "Program Integrity and Appeals"





Why is there Program Integrity?

- 1. Required by the Federal Government
- 2. Must pay back the federal share
- 3. OMPP wants to do a lot of amazing things




How are things done?

- Data Mining: focuses on issues reflected in our data
- Peer Provider Comparison: comparing providers amongst themselves
- Outside referrals received from Provider and Member concern line
- Referrals from other FSSA divisions
