EXECUTIVE ORDER

DECLARING A DISASTER EMERGENCY IN POSEY COUNTY DUE TO SEVERE WEATHER AND TORNADIC ACTIVITY

TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY COME, GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, Indiana Code § 10-14-3-12 provides that the Governor shall declare a disaster emergency by executive order if he determines that a disaster involving widespread or severe damage, injury, or loss of life or property has occurred or that the occurrence or threat of a disaster is imminent;

WHEREAS, on April 2, 2024, severe weather, tornadic activity, and high winds caused widespread damage throughout Posey County and other areas of the State;

WHEREAS, this severe weather resulted in damage/destruction of homes, businesses, infrastructure, and other structures; loss of power; downing of trees and power lines; and damage to or closure of roads; and

WHEREAS, immediately following this severe weather event, state and local officials initiated emergency response activities and also damage assessments which were completed on May 10, 2024 and resulted in a finding that this event exceeds the threshold, and thus qualifies, for public assistance through the State Disaster Relief Fund, IC § 10-14-4-7, and this executive order is being issued in connection with activating same;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Eric J. Holcomb, by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Indiana, do hereby:

that a state of disaster emergency exists in Posey County, which shall be effective immediately and, pursuant to Indiana Code § 10-14-3-12, shall continue for a period of thirty (30) days; and

ORDER the IDHS Executive Director to coordinate any and all necessary assistance with the appropriate federal, state, and local agencies.
