EXECUTIVE ORDER

FOR:

PROVIDING A COMPLAINT PROCEDURE TO STATE EMPLOYEES AND RESCINDING CERTAIN PRIOR EXECUTIVE ORDERS

TO ALL WHOM THESE PRESENTS MAY COME, GREETINGS.

WHEREAS, state employees should have available a complaint and hearing process for contested disciplinary actions; and

the State must move forward with meaningful reforms, including improvements in the WHEREAS.

State's personnel system, while acknowledging the right of state employees to voluntarily

belong to a union:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Mitchell E. Daniels, Jr., by virtue of the authority vested in me as Governor of the State of Indiana, do hereby order that:

- The following complaint procedure is established: 1.
 - An employee of the non-merit service, as defined in 31 IAC 1-1-1, who:
 - Does not have standing to file a complaint under a statute or rule, i.
 - ii. Has at least six (6) months of continuous full-time or twelve (12) months of continuous part-time employment,
 - Is not classified in the ESM or SAM/PAT job categories, and iii.
 - Is not employed on a temporary or intermittent basis

may file a complaint concerning the employee's dismissal, demotion, or suspension without pay.

- The complaint must be filed in writing with the State Employees Appeals Commission, b. within thirty (30) calendar days from the date the employee receives notice of the disciplinary action.
- The State Employees Appeals Commission will determine whether the suspension, c. demotion, or dismissal was based on inadequate performance or inappropriate behavior.
- Determinations by the State Employee Appeals Commission are subject to judicial d. review in accordance with the Administrative Orders and Procedures Act.
- 2. Executive Orders 90-6, 97-8, and 03-35 are rescinded and declared null and void.
- 3. Executive Orders 03-44, 03-45, and 04-01, together with all prior Executive Orders approving union Settlements, are rescinded and declared null and void.
