JOBS AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

Provided over \$1 billion dollars for the preservation of state roads and local roads over the next two years without raising taxes and makes immediately available \$418 million in Local Option Income Tax (LOIT) reserves to local government to help improve local roads and bridges across the state

[HEA 1001 & SEA 67]

Provided the Department of Administration the ability to certify veteran-owned businesses and expanded who can be certified as a veteran-owned small business. **[HEA 1312]**

Fully funded all three Regional Cities proposals (\$126 million total) instead of two. **[HEA 1001]**

EDUCATION

Ensured schools would be held harmless for their A-F accountability grade for the 2014-2015 year **[SEA 200]**

Ensured teacher bonuses and evaluations are not negatively impacted to accommodate the transition to more rigorous academic standards **[HEA 1003]**

HEALTH CARE & COMBATTING DRUG ABUSE

Established the Indiana Commission to Combat Drug Abuse to address drug abuse issues at the state and local level **[SEA 271]**

Allowed immunity for certain individuals who call emergency personnel and administer Naloxone when an individual is at risk of a drug overdose [SEA 187]

Put HIP 2.0 in law to protect the more than 370,000 individuals currently enrolled **[SEA 165]**
