Web-based forms now available

The Assessment Team is now using web-based forms (paperless) for ease in processing referrals and gathering the needed paperwork for assessment and consultation. These web-based forms allow for immediate notification of Center staff when a submission has occurred and opportunities to upload needed documentation for more efficient processing. They are available in English and Spanish through a selection on the home page and have a feature that allows words to be read if selected. Parents and professionals can use web based forms to:

- Submit a Referral to the Assessment Team
- Complete a Center Release of Information
- Complete a Social Developmental History form
- Complete an <u>Updated Background Information</u> (if the child has been assessed at the Center before)


Virginia "Gigi" Bartholomew
