Message from Indiana State Cancer Registry to Healthcare Providers

The Indiana State Cancer Registry (ISCR) would like to remind health care providers in Indiana of state-mandated cancer case reporting requirement:

- Starting from Jan. 1, 2026, please avoid "paper reporting" of cancer cases (mailed, faxed, scanned records).
- We encourage switching to **electronic reporting** by using a secure WebPlus portal at https://webplus.isdh.in.gov/logonen.aspx. Contact us at CancerRegistry@health.IN.gov to get your user ID and password.
- Access further instructions on how to abstract (fill out) cancer cases in WebPlus and how to submit files to us at:
 - 1) Health: CDPC: Policy and Procedure Manuals
 - 2) <u>FCDS LMS Frontend Log In</u> (register as a new user to access materials)
- To receive timely updates from us, submit or update your **contact information** through the QR code on the right or <u>here</u>.

ISCR was established for the purpose of recording cancer cases required to be reported by the federal National Program of Cancer Registries and by <u>Indiana Code 16-38-2</u> and <u>Indiana Administrative Code, 410 IAC 21-1</u>. Cancer case reporting is mandatory for hospitals, physicians, dentists, medical laboratories, radiation or medical oncology clinics, outpatient surgical centers, nursing homes and other health facilities.
