To take advantage of this opportunity, we ask you to send an email confirming your interest in having an IAQ Assessment of your building(s) and to identify a point of contact (POC) to work with EPA.

The POC coordinates the entire assessment with EPA, including inviting scheduling, identifying locations and attendees; provides access to all locations (or can direct others to provide access); and provides follow-up to EPA after the assessment including information on recommendations adopted.
