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Health Literacy

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What made us think about health literacy?

- We've noticed a wide range of different health literacy levels throughout our patients.
- We sometimes get into using a lot of acronyms and medical language that is not common every day use for others outside the medical field.
- We want to make sure all our patients have a good understanding of their care and can be in control of their health.

What do we use?

- We use the Short Assessment of Health Literacy-English (SAHL-E) and the Short Assessment of Health Literacy-Spanish (SAHL-S)
- We administer the test via laminated flash cards during a patients intake.
 - If we find that already established patients are in need of this assessment, we will administer to them as well.

Scoring of health literacy assessment

1. kidney	urine	fever	don't know

Scoring of health literacy assessment

- The answer key is laminated, with the correct answers highlighted.
- The nurse administering the test will mark and tally up the score out of the total 18.
- The item is counted wrong if the word is mispronounced or if the wrong associated word is picked. Each line is worth 1 point in total.
- Scores between o-14 suggest examinee has low health literacy.

Utilization of Health literacy Assessment

- What do we do with the assessment now that it's complete?
 - In our clinical system we have an area to annotate their health literacy score.
 - It is documented in the intake note as well.
 - We make sure all staff that will interact with patient is aware of health literacy issues.
 - This helps staff to adjust their language to fit the patients understanding.
