ILINet Sentinel Site Program

This is a community, statewide and national program that monitors influenza-like illness activity during the influenza season each year.

This program is vital for monitoring the prevalence and spread of influenza viruses.

Information provided by ILINet Sentinel Sites is used to help guide the prevention and control activities, patient care, and vaccine development for Indiana and the United States.

Participation is completely voluntary and totally FREE.

ILINet Sentinel Sites are provided with FREE influenza A/B and SARS-CoV-2 rapid tests, along with FREE specimen subtyping at IDOH Laboratory.

Objectives of Influenza Surveillance

- Monitor influenza-like illness (ILI) activity
- Rapidly detect novel influenza events
- Describe seasonal occurrence of influenza
- Determine the types of circulating influenza viruses and non-influenza respiratory viruses
- Inform healthcare professionals and public health partners with weekly influenza surveillance data and reports
- Support influenza vaccination with real -world influenza surveillance data
- Respond to community or institutional ILI outbreaks

<u>ILI Definition</u> = **fever** (measured >100°F, 37.8°C) plus **cough** and/or **sore throat**

- 2. Commit to reporting ILI Activity on a weekly basis during the influenza season.
