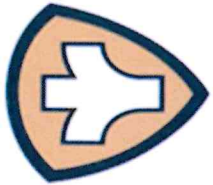

## **Public Health Preparedness Report**

Dubois County Health Department Preparedness Coordinator and Backup both have completed IDOH Provided REDCap Survey submitting 24/7 contact information, PSID#, FEMA SID#, along with IDHS Acadis registration confirmation. Completed IDOH Let Jurisdictional Risk Assessment (JRA) and PHHRA Data.

Both have completed FEMA Training including: IS 700b, IS 800c, IS 100c, IS 200c, IS 242c, IS 244b, IS 520, IS 241c, and IS 2200. Shawn, Preparedness Coordinator has also completed IS 300 and IS 400.

Conducted bi-annual meetings with LHD Leadership, Public Health Nurse/ Immunization Nurse and other LHD Staff to review SVI Data and to collaborate, communicate, and coordinate with the LHD Leadership, Immunizations Staff/Public Health Nurse to ensure equitable, accessible vaccines and other medical countermeasures as needed in an emergency.

Ensured DCHD plans and existing MOU's between LHD and partner agencies, POD Sites, along with identified community partners are maintained and up to date on a regular cadence, annually at a minimum.

Reviewed and updated all LHD Preparedness Plans including: POD Plans, COOP Plan, Infectious Disease Plan, MCM Plan, and all associated annexes included the EOP, ESF-8, Volunteer Management Plan, Crisis Emergency Risk Communication, etc.
