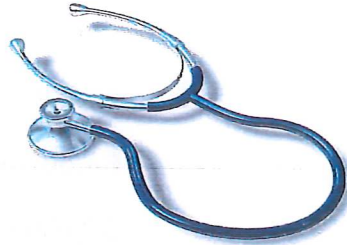

Nursing & School Liaison Report

The Department has done many changes in this past year for our community by offering new services with additional training in many areas to better serve Fayette County. We continue to be involved many public events this year that is gear towards improving public such as providing health supplies, essential resources, new health services and different literature to the general public. The events and services are listed below.

First Quarter

1. Updated training in NBS case management, TB training, Vape training, Lead training, and Core Tracking training for HFI KPI's.
2. Participated in Outreach Festival for the homeless shelter sponsored by MDWise.
3. Participated in the Little Spartans Readiness Carnival and Kindergarten Round Up.

Second Quarter

1. Participated in the Annual Bunnies and Brownies Event sponsored by FireFly.
2. Started testing for HIV and HepC testing, partnering with Wayne County Health Department. The partnership is dissolved at this time the department had a free Sports Physical Clinic for any student athlete in middle school and high school.
3. The departments had a meet and greet with IDOH Commissioner Dr Weaver and the District #6 Administration team.
4. The department team members all pitch in and got a designated private clinical room organized.
5. Nursing staff participated in a Phlebotomy a refresher course by IDOH clinical. This was to prepare for our lab services.

Third Quarter

1. The department sponsored a community health fair with 21 vendors. Great turn out.
2. The department participated in an exercise pod with Union County for Anthrax Attack.
3. The department offered a second Sports Physical night for student athletes.
4. We are contracted with Indiana Health Information Exchange (IHIE) for case management documentation.
5. We purchased new a refrigeration unit and freezer unit with the immunization grant.
6. We have hired Rachel Tincher to help with medical/clerical duties and be our point person for the HIV & HepC testing.
7. The department now offers low cost lab service for the public. We are contracted with LabCorp, we have currently done 21 lab draws at this time.

2024 Annual Report

During 2024, 14 new and 4 repair septic permits were issued, this was a similar amount to the prior year. Every permit required a minimum of one site inspection and one final inspection. A third visit was made to most sites to check on installation and answer installers questions. Well permits were issued with new septic permits. Sites were investigated prior to issuing permits and after installation was done by licensed installers.

Complaints were investigated by myself and staff during 2024, for poor conditions, mold, general nuisance/trash, and sewage discharge. Steps were taken to resolve all complaints. Mosquito sites were treated with a biological control agent made available to the public for free. Worked with ISDH to monitor mosquito pools for West Nile. Risk analysis for children with high lead levels were completed and reported as required by State Dept. of Health. Indoor air quality tests were completed to make sure indoor environments were safe. Home visits also made with Fayette County Department of Children and Services, Adult Protection and at requests of Fayette Co. School Corporation. Worked with representatives of IDEM and ISDH to inspect trailer parks, campgrounds, farms, industry and dump sites. Any violations to Health codes ordered corrected.

Weekly Water Samples were submitted by the Fayette Co. School Corporation and by Fayette Memorial Hospital; these samples are monitored for safety. Monthly water samples were also monitored from Pleasantview Utilities, St. Judes Village, Connersville Parks Dept. and other public facilities. Samples returned as satisfactory samples or repeat samples were taken. Private well samples were submitted and monitored, if samples showed bacteria, information was supplied to the owners for decontamination of their well.

Animal bite reports were received; the animal's owners were asked to voluntarily quarantine their animals at home for 15 days of observation.

Attended meetings and set on panels for local boards. I have continued to work with the public health District for preparedness. As administrator, continued working with staff to improve services provided to the community, improve public health and create a good work environment for employees. Apply for grants to improve services and work towards implementing the new Governors Public Health Guidelines.
