- <u>Emergency and Disaster Management in Long Term Care</u> starting on May 14

 - Topics covered include the four phases of emergency management, review of CMS risk assessment template and self-assessment checklist, tabletop exercises, improving your Emergency Action Plan (EAP), emergency communications, the importance of documentation, and training in a high turnover field.

- <u>Pressure Injury Prevention and Management in Long Term Care</u> starting April 10
 - o Taught by Jeri Ann Lundgren, RN, BSN, PHN, CWS, CWCN, CPT
 - Topics covered include utilizing QAPI to set up an effective pressure injury prevention program, risk assessment, care planning, prevention of skin breakdown, assessment, staging, topical treatment, and lower extremity ulcers.
