What YOU Need to Know about Infection Prevention - Earn a Certificate

What YOU Need to Know about Infection Prevention is a cost-free, online fivemodule course addressing various aspects of infection prevention and control. The course was made possible by a collaboration between the <u>Indiana Department of</u> <u>Health</u>, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's <u>Project Firstline</u>, and the <u>University of Indianapolis Center for Aging & Community</u>. The five modules were developed with input from Indiana healthcare workers on their desire for further education in infection prevention. The modules are:

- How Does Science Work?
- How Do I Know What Guidelines to Listen To?
- Using Clinical Guidelines Beyond the Clinic
- Recognize Infection Risks in Healthcare
- Candida auris: Stopping the Spread
