HHS Awards Grants to Address Mental Health & Substance Use Crisis

On Dec. 16, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) awarded \$47 million to states and territories to support 988 Crisis Lifeline Services. This funding will enhance the 988 system by maintaining language-based services, ensuring effective system routing, and improving access to specialized care for populations at higher risk for suicide. The additional funding to support the 988 Crisis Lifeline is important to address the ongoing mental health challenges that individuals face in wake of the COVID-19 pandemic. National data indicates that the rates of suicides and drug overdoses increased in 2021, suggesting lingering impacts from the global pandemic.

In early 2023, HHS plans to award \$21.1 million to improve 988 services in tribal communities. These communities tend to face unique challenges to accessing technology and crisis services, so

funding is critical to ensure individuals have access to 988 services. Since the 988 Crisis Lifeline was launched in July 2022, legislators and public health professionals have been collaborating at the local, state, and national levels to ensure a smooth rollout. "The funding provided by the Bipartisan Safer Communities Act helps ensure that there is no wrong door to access behavioral health care", said HHS Deputy Andrea Palm.

The Impacts of Trauma on the Brain


