#### **Beyond Substance Podcast**

Beyond Substance is a podcast that seeks to deepen understanding about substance use in Marion County, focusing on the problems and solutions for these issues. Episodes seek to highlight what can be done to foster and support recovery. It's cohosted by Dean Babcock and Jodi Miller.

The first episode, "When Tragedy Sparks Hope," aired in late August 2022 and explores perspectives on substance use and overdose from people who work in the field, as well as what we experience when we are personally affected by substance use. It can be listened to on all major podcast platforms, including Apple Podcasts, Google Podcasts and Spotify.

#### **Creating Healthy Families Panel Hosted by Volunteers of America**

Earlier this month, Volunteers of America hosted a moderated panel, "Creating Healthy Families," that highlighted substance use disorder in women. About 70% of women who receive treatment for substance use disorder have children. Moreover, studies have shown that women who receive treatment where they can live with their children have better outcomes. In fact, Volunteers of America's Fresh Start Recovery Centers are family-focused residential addictions treatment programs that allow mothers and children to stay together during treatment.

Fresh Start Recovery Centers can be found in Indianapolis, Winchester, Evansville and Columbus. Volunteers of America has acquired funding to open a new center, but a location has not yet been identified.

### Funding Awarded to Indiana Not-for-profits to Support Affordable Housing

Lt. Gov. Suzanne Crouch and the Indiana Housing and Community Development Authority announced \$950,000 in grant funding will be awarded as part of the <u>Indiana Housing First Program</u>. These organizations provide services such as tenant-based rental assistance and supportive services to individuals with severe mental illness or substance use disorder who are also facing a housing crisis or exiting a residential treatment program. This Housing First approach seeks to quickly connect individuals experiencing a housing crisis to permanent housing without barriers to entry.

The funds were awarded to Housing Opportunities, Helping Veterans and Families of Indiana, LTHC Homeless Services (Formerly Lafayette Transitional Housing Center), and Young Women's Christian Association of Northeast Indiana.

### Many Paths, One Objective: Recovery


2 p.m. – 3:30 p.m. EDT, Sept. 29 Hosted by: Central East PTTC
