

HISTORICAL STOPS ON THE TOUR

1. THAD BUTLER – newspaper editor and publisher, promoter of the Wabash Light.
2. LEVI ROSS – Early settler, fought in both Mexican and Civil Wars, a participated in the 1849 Gold Rush.
3. ELIJAH HACKLEMAN – First county historian, early surveyor county clerk and in State Legislature.
4. ROSE KIDD BEERE – doctor, first female nurse to Philippines in the Spanish American War.
5. WARREN BIGLER – First president State Association of Abstractors, 1st abstractor in Wabash County, friend of William McKinley and Teddy Roosevelt, 1905 appointed Indiana State Auditor.
6. DR. JAMES T. BIGGERSTAFF - Early doctor in Wabash County, one of the founders of the Wabash County Historical Society and Museum, County Health Commissioner 1918-1919.
7. TERREL JACOBS – The Lion King, circus performer, lion tamer, movie star, captured Modoc.
8. ELIZA LITTLEFIELD – early teacher who taught in first school built in Wabash. Came from Main in 1848 died 1851,
9. KENNETH “BILL” GRAY - U.S.Naval officer, participated in search for Amelia Earhart and survivor of Pearl Harbor.
10. PAULINE GEYER – Wabash Valley Dance Theatre instructor for many years.

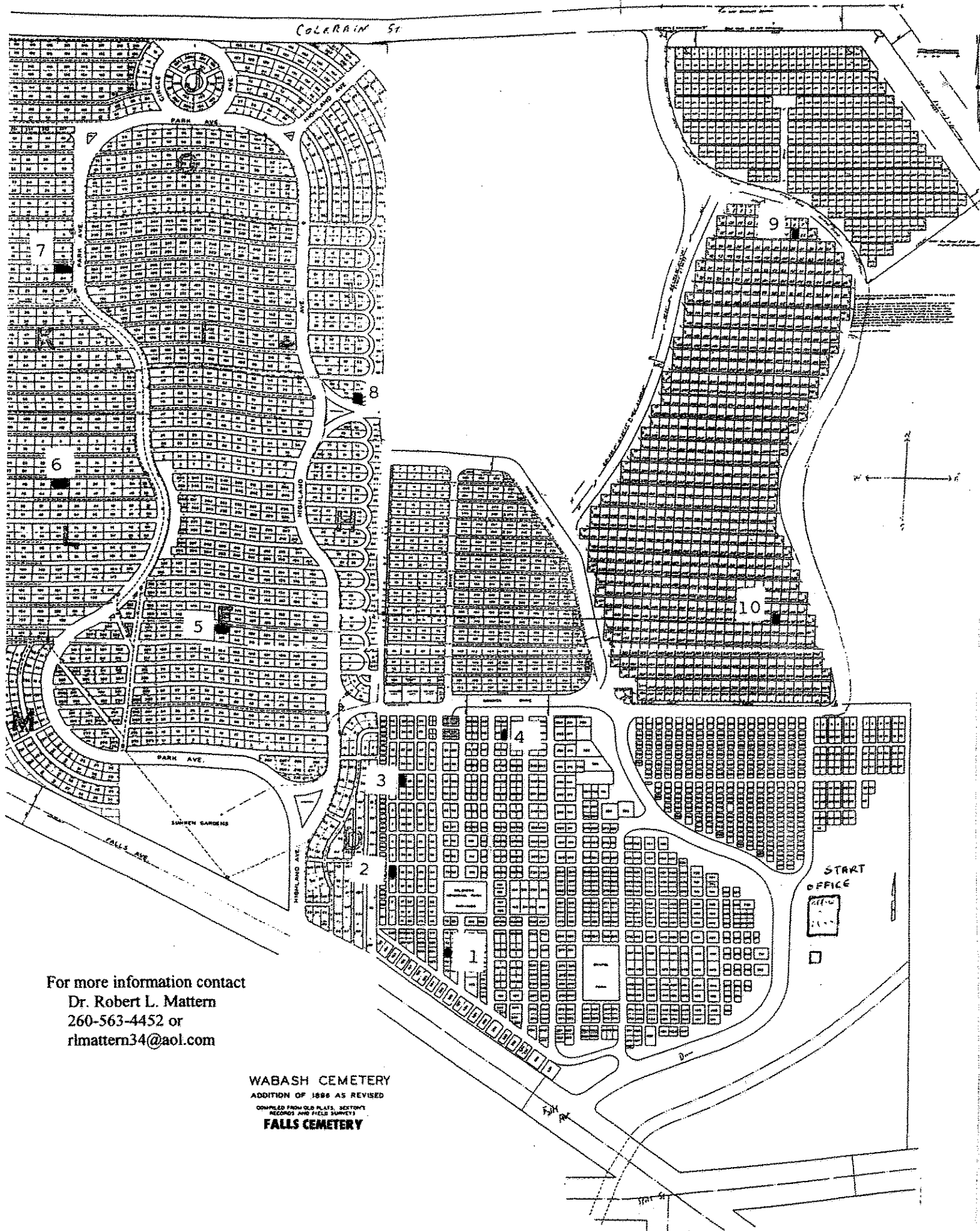
