EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Caesars Entertainment Racing is now in its ninth year of operations and sixth season since being purchased by Eldorado Gaming at Horseshoe Indianapolis and Harrah's Hoosier Park. Many projects and enhancements have been completed with more on the horizon. The 2025 racing season completed the fifth year of a 10-year Racing Capital Fund Advisory Committee plan, along with the 15 year rolling equipment plan more than \$22 million has been provided to improve facilities, upgrade equipment and push positive initiatives towards the upward trend of racing at both facilities.

Caesars Entertainment continues to join the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, Indiana breed organizations and Indiana horsemen and horsewomen to lift Indiana horse racing to a national level. Both racing facilities have continued this year in elevating their racing product, showing record handles and increased exposure throughout North America and beyond.

As a company, Caesars Entertainment is committed to building a racing brand that exceeds all expectations. The Caesars properties under the Harrah's and Horseshoe racing names are gaining notice as a major player in horse racing. Both Indiana properties lead the way and have become a model for the rest of the Caesars-owned racing properties as the commitment continues.

Once again in 2025, Caesars Entertainment provided the tools and platform for our breeds to have successful racing seasons. Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and Horseshoe Indianapolis Racing & Casino have provided a review from 2025 as well as strategic plans for the upcoming racing season.

Caesars Entertainment Racing has and will continue to work toward the goals of all racing entities in the state. The momentum continues as the calendar changes to 2026.


Caesars Entertainment strives to be a leader in gaming, racing, entertainment, sports betting, and rewards. The company's Caesars Rewards program, which has an extension that covers racing, has been voted the best in the gaming industry. The company is also committed to its Racebook operations, which have expanded to include 22 states through the company's relationship with NYRA Bets. Caesars Sports and Racebooks now have a shared wallet in 7 states, for the convenience of our sports and race customers. As a result, Caesars Rewards can offer great incentives and added value to racing customers that most platforms cannot match, making the program for customers one of the most lucrative in racing.

Caesars Racing also continues its racing sponsorships, including a major sponsor of Jockeys & Jeans and the title sponsorship of the annual Dan Patch Awards, hosted by the U.S. Harness Writer's Association in Florida.

On a national level, Caesars Racing completed its new Grandstand at Scioto Downs and a new 16 race paddock, considered the best in the country. In Nebraska, we have completed a new 1 mile Thoroughbred track and completed our second meet to great reviews.

HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK 2025 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



The 2025 racing season at Harrah's Hoosier Park proved to be a record breaking meet in terms of amount handled over the course of the year. Harrah's Hoosier Park surpassed the previous all-time handle record of \$124 million for a 160-day harness meet on October 16 of 2025, still with 23 race dates left on the calendar. The previous record was established in 2023 when Harrah's Hoosier Park played host to the Breeders Crown for a third time. As of the conclusion of the race meet, the total 2025 handle for Harrah's Hoosier Park exceeded \$141 million.

Despite facing a severe horse shortage to begin the meet, handle numbers held serve year-over-year before taking off as the horse population began to stabilize. The race meet saw handles increase by double-digits in terms of percentage year-over-year, anywhere between 12-94%. The average handle per card in 2025 was over \$818,000 vs \$633,000 in 2024. In all, handles surpassed the \$1 million mark 22 times during the 2025 meet, up from seven times in 2024. The four signature stakes night of the meet all saw year-over-year increases in handle, three of which were all-time records for their respective night.

Dan Patch Stakes night on Friday, Aug. 8 saw year-over-year growth with handle for the night a strong \$1,375,635, up slightly from \$1,363,602 in 2024 despite increased competition for wagering dollars from harness racing's largest signal, The Meadowlands. Meanwhile, for just the third time in the race's 32-year history, an Indiana sired horse captured the Dan Patch title as Sabonis crossed the wire first.

The sport of harness racing introduced a Graded Stake system in 2025 which saw Harrah's Hoosier Park host a pair of Grade 1 events in the Peter Haughton and Jim Doherty Memorial races for two-year-old trotters on September 12. Since Harrah's Hoosier Park began hosting those races in 2023, the evening has quickly become one of the signature cards each year on the racing calendar. Handle swelled to \$1,498,684 in 2025 for the night, a record since the races have been hosted at HHP and up from \$1,249,955 in 2024.

A short-lived handle record for a non-Breeders Crown card occurred on September 19 during the Caesars Trotting Classic night with \$1,705,334 wagered on the card. This was up from \$1,671,740 in 2024 despite having one less race on the evening.

The record was short lived due to Hoosier Champions night putting a cherry on top of the record-breaking signature nights on October 10. A record-breaking handle of \$1,770,224 was wagered on the Hoosier Champions card, up from \$1,249,955 in 2024. This coincided with the

Hoosier Champions card being broadcast live on national television for the first time, joining the Dan Patch and Caesars Trotting Classic cards with a three-hour show on FOX Sports, putting the Indiana product on the national stage.

In all, handle is up 30% year-over-year when in 2025 compared to 2024, while handle in the entire industry in the United States is currently down nearly 9% year-over-year, and the average number of starters per race at HHP is down 2.5%.

More than just handle records were broken during the 2025 season, as the sixth annual Empire of Hope fundraiser for the Standardbred Transition Alliance raised \$73,500, up from the previous record of \$57,000 with all proceeds dedicated to the aftercare of retired standardbreds.

Records were also broken on the racetrack, with the Indiana Sired Odds On Mr Mamba becoming the fastest two-year-old pacer in the sport's history with his 1:47.3 clocking for a mile at Harrah's Hoosier Park on October 2. This was the first time in track history that a world record mile was recorded at Harrah's Hoosier Park. In 2025, Harrah's Hoosier Park reversed a 5% purse cut that was installed in June of 2024, maintaining purses all season long due to record handle numbers.

Harrah's Hoosier Park continues to be active in the community, giving both funds and time. The company will continue to donate to local community organizations in addition to time committed to efforts within the community.

Race Marketing expenditures will reach \$700,000 in 2025 in an effort to promote our live harness racing product. Additionally, continuous efforts are being made to 'winterize' the barn area as Harrah's Hoosier Park prepares for a mid-February start in 2026 in addition to year-round training.

Lastly, we continue to collaborate with the Indiana Standardbred Association on a regular basis with face-to-face meetings on a wide variety of topics such as the racing calendar, racing conditions, promotional efforts and much more. Harrah's Hoosier Park will continue to work in tandem with the ISA in almost every facet of our racing operation.





HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

- · Record handle year with Handle projected to surpass \$141 million during the 2025 meet.
- Live entertainment, children's activities and cornhole offered regularly in the Hoosier Outdoor Patio (The HOP) on weekends during summer months.
- The sixth annual Empire of Hope event raised a record \$73,500 for the aftercare of retired Standardbred racehorses.
- Harrah's Hoosier Park was selected as the #2 Best Place to Work (Large Company Category) by the Indiana Chamber of Commerce from a pool of 1,300 businesses.
- Harrah's Hoosier Park hosted a full carnival in the southern most parking lot as part of the "Summertime Kick-Off" event for both quests and team members.
- The annual Fourth of July Fireworks show was conducted in front of a record crowd of over 3,000 guests on the track apron.
- The fractional ownership group First Turn Stable returned for its tenth season, giving its 40 members a glimpse into horse racing ownership with trainer Patrizio Ancora.
- Fright Night at the Races took place with a rousing crowd, with 25 local partners participating in the Trunk or Treat which served over 1,000 kids. Additional activities included the Horse Costume Contest, Corn Maze, and Live Music.
- · Harrah's Hoosier Park continues to offer an on-site wagering contest every night of the racing season.
- Racing was broadcast live on FOX Sports on May 17, August 9 (Dan Patch), September 19 (Caesars Trotting Classic), and October 10 (Hoosier Champions).
- The on-track simulcast was revitalized to include commentary on each race and reduce dead-air time while featuring guest handicappers such as Bob Heyden, Emily Gaskin, Jessica Otten and Jenna Otten.

- Live radio remotes have taken place at Harrah's Hoosier Park, along with Off-Track Betting facilities in New Haven and Indianapolis.
- HHP continues to have commercial segments on all local Indianapolis television affiliates (ABC, FOX, CBS and WISH TV).
- HHP saw increased dining specials in the Homestretch Clubhouse and Steakhouse during the live racing season.
- Collectable program covers were featured during HHP's signature race nights such as Dan Patch, Caesars Trotting Classic and Hoosier Champions.



HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK 2025 SPONSORSHIPS HIGHLIGHTS

Harrah's Hoosier Park continued to work hard in 2025 to continue strong relationships, while building new relationships within and outside of the racing industry. Harrah's Hoosier Park worked to provide offerings to pair with signature racing events, simulcast assets, as well as physical on property signage. This compares favorably to last year in which \$70,500 was raised in sponsorships.

HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK 2026 RACING DATES

Harrah's Hoosier Park and the Indiana Standardbred Association have worked together and agreed upon the 2026 racing calendar.

In an effort to avoid situations where the horse population cannot support the number of race days over the course of the week, the 2026 meet will begin much earlier, with a start date of February 12. The race week will consist of a two-day Thursday and Friday schedule throughout all of February and March, before introducing Wednesdays in April. Saturday racing will begin in May, with the Tuesday-Saturday five-day week schedules taking place between June 16 and Sept. 26.

First post time will continue to be 5: 30 PM daily.

2026 WAGERING MENU

With approval from the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, Harrah's Hoosier Park will maintain the same wagering menu that was introduced in March of 2025 which has yielded record breaking results. As far as the exotic wagering is concerned, the wagering menu will include Early and Late Doubles, three Pick 3's, two Pick 4's, two Pick 5's, a Pick 6 and two Hoosier High 5's.

There will be exacta, trifecta and superfecta wagering on every race that qualifies based on the number of horses needed to conduct such wagering. The only exception to this is on races that include a Hoosier High 5, superfecta wagering will not be offered.

Additionally, Harrah's Hoosier Park will continue to offer instant carryovers on Superfecta, Hoosier High 5, Pick 3, Pick 4, Pick 5, and Pick 6 wagering

HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK HANDLE NARRATIVE

Harrah's Hoosier Park saw a record-breaking handle year for the fourth time in the last five years in 2025. Wagering on Harrah's Hoosier Park races from off property sources grew immensely with export handle reached almost \$130,000,000 at the end of the racing meet. On-track handle was down once again in 2025 as much of the game continues to move to wagering from home or on the go via phone. While on-track handle on HHP races was down in 2025, simulcast wagering within the building was up 11% on the year.

For 2026, we are looking to continue to grow our export handle with the changes made to the racing schedule, while maintaining levels in Australia. Meanwhile, we will anticipate another slight decline in on-track wagering for the year.

At the time of this writing the 2026 Horsemen's Agreement between Harrah's Hoosier Park and the Indiana Standardbred Association has been signed by both parties and distributed to the IHRC.

ADW AGREEMENTS & SOURCE MARKET FEES

The Advance Deposit Wagering ("ADW") companies continue to be a key source for handle when it comes to pari-mutuel wagering in North America. That statement holds true for the state of Indiana also.

For 2025, we budgeted at \$4.6 million but as we continue to track throughout this year it appears that we will come in slightly lower than we had projected. At the end of October, we are now projecting that number to be \$4 million by the end of the year, which will also be the baseline budget number for 2026.

Harrah's Hoosier Park and Horseshoe Indianapolis continue to have all major ADW companies under contract. They include FanDuel, TwinSpires, Xpressbet, NYRA Bets, Caesars Racebook, Penn Gaming and Premier Turf Club.



HHP works in tandem with the ISA on important racing issues that impact the racing operation and the horsemen and horsewomen that live, work and race at HHP.

Whether it be race dates, RCFAC Capital Items, or day-to-day issues that impact racing operations at HHP, the ISA's input is very much valued.

Meetings have been held throughout the year with various ISA committees to discuss, plan and workout any issue that needs to be addressed. Furthermore, The HHP GM of Racing meets regularly with the ISA to discuss any and all topics related to the racing operation in an effort to solve whatever challenges there may be before they become major issues.

HHP and the ISA have teamed up together in partnership for numerous events throughout the 2025 season, including horsemen events/meals, helmet coverage, gifts for grooms during signature events and much more and looks forward to continuing to do so in the future.





HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK'S COMMITMENT TO EQUINE SAFETY & INTEGRITY

To ensure the safety of our equine athletes, Harrah's Hoosier Park employs a Director of Veterinary Services on a full-time, year-round basis. Our Track Veterinarian inspects each equine participant as she steps on to the racetrack and while warming up to determine to her satisfaction that the horse has demonstrated there are no health or soundness issues prohibiting that horse from racing. If there is any question as to whether a particular horse is questionable with regards to racing, our Vet has the authority to scratch a horse out of a race. Our Track Veterinarian also monitors equine health conditions from around North America to make sure there is no horse coming from a jurisdiction with a health issue that could endanger the horses residing and racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Harrah's Hoosier Park also employs a full-time, year-round Track Superintendent and a full-time, year-round Track Maintenance crew. During the racing season the crew is divided into morning and evening teams, with Leads assigned to both crews, to ensure that the track is the best it can be for morning training as well as in the evening for live racing. We always seek input from the Indiana Standardbred Association as to the condition of the racing surface.

During the racing season Harrah's Hoosier Park also has on retainer and brings in the internationally renowned Coon Brothers, considered to be the foremost track consultants in the harness racing industry, to meet with our Track Superintendent to determine if there are any racing surface issues that may need to be addressed. During 2025 both Greg and Dan Coon have paid visits to Harrah's Hoosier Park.

Finally, it should be noted that Harrah's Hoosier Park remains the only harness track in North America that has 100% state-of-the-art camera coverage of all barn area stalls. Harrah's Hoosier Park employs a dedicated security officer to monitor and view all camera activity daily.

2026 RACING CAPITAL PLANNED EXPENDITURES

Harrah's Hoosier Park is planning on spending approximately \$700,000 in Capital Projects/Purchases in 2026 between the 15-year Equipment List and the Racing Capital Fund Advisory Committee ("RCFAC") list to not only maintain the racing facility in a first-class manner but to also continue to make the facility an even better one for our horsemen to race at and our patrons to enjoy. Please note that we will be submitting substitute items at a future date.

HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK MARKETING & BUDGET OVERVIEW

The 2025 racing season at Harrah's Hoosier Park proved to be not only successful, but an exciting time to approach the previous Marketing strategy with an eye on refining the ways in which we connect with our guests. Exceeding even the record breaking highs of 2023, 2025 was a year for Harrah's Hoosier Park to take a fresh look at the business and implement new strategies that continue to improve the experience for both our racing fans both on and off the track.

As always, Harrah's Hoosier Park's signature stakes nights - The Dan Patch Stakes, Caesars Trotting Classic, and Hoosier Champions – saw crowds of eager racing fans ready to enjoy a night of promotions and world class harness racing. Additionally, events such as the Kentucky Derby Day, Fourth of July, Empire of Hope, and our inaugural Low Rider 500 Wiener Dog Races brought in many visitors, both new and old, to experience what Hoosier Park has to offer guests.

Throughout the season, our team endeavored to build out entertainment events that appeal to all ages. Key weekends held host to food trucks, live music, roaming entertainment, carnival rides, and giveaways.

To that end, the Hoosier Outdoor Patio (The HOP) was taken full advantage of, being used as a place where live entertainment or food trucks could set up on select days throughout the season. We're extremely proud of that space, which has quickly become a popular hangout for our racing guests, even on days when entertainment is not present.

Relationships with local news affiliates were continued in 2025, ensuring Harrah's Hoosier Park's biggest events were promoted widely to the local community. Currently, we have run full length segments on such series as Indy Now, Lifestyle Live, Business Equity & Opportunities, with more to come in the following years as we increase our focus in the television arena. Commercial units for racing currently run on Fox 59, WRTV (ABC), WISH, CBS 4, and WTHR (NBC). In addition to this focus on more generalized media, we are still committed to investing in our many outstanding racing media partners.

Harrah's Hoosier Park is excited for the 2026 racing season, which will get to implement these strategies, which we proved extremely successful throughout this year's meet, continue to be finessed. We will of course continue featuring our targeted marketing strategies, events and promotions. Race Marketing spend will maintain that of 2025 levels.

Harrah's Hoosier Park focuses on three primary audiences for its marketing efforts: on-track customers, on-track VIP customers and simulcast wagering customers.

The focus for the 2026 racing season is to continue to entice new visitors and casual race fans while continuing to reward our most loyal guests.

A tool Harrah's Hoosier Park utilizes for tracking on-track play and engagement is through understanding the racing-dominant database in Caesars Rewards to understand what guests are responding positively to, and where the track sees opportunities to improve upon.

Currently, Harrah's Hoosier Park has 673 dominant racing guests. Of those guests, 208 have received race wagers on a weekly basis as a form of Caesars Rewards reinvestment.

In 2026, Race Marketing's goal will be to increase Caesars Rewards rated racing play through the various initiatives listed in the pertinent section.

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ON-TRACK VIP

In 2026, Harrah's Hoosier Park will focus on maintaining perks and benefits for VIP and VVIP programs while creating new and exciting benefits to reward those maximizing their Caesars Rewards play while enticing others to do the same.


Harrah's Hoosier Park implements three levels of VIP Programs based on 12-month Racing Theoretical Wagering (THEO) – Show (\$10,000-\$14,999 THEO), Place (\$15,000-\$19,999 THEO) and Win (\$20,000+ THEO). Each group receives complimentary handicapping materials aligning with their level of VIP status. Show members receive \$12 daily, Place \$23 daily, and Win \$36 daily. In 2025, Harrah's Hoosier Park maintained its 2024 levels with a total of 80 VIP guests.

Additionally, VVIP guests have access to not only VIP benefits, but exclusive signature racing events such as Racing GM's Mix & Mingle parties, VVIP promotions such as Bet or MegaBet promotions, along with other drawings and offers.

For the 2025 racing season, Harrah's Hoosier Park created a new class of VVIP designed to increase rewards and benefits for its most loyal players while also maintaining the additional VIP/VVIP tiers. This tier currently has 31 members.

With both the VIP and VVIP players being Harrah's Hoosier Park's most loyal guests, the Race Marketing department continues to embrace in person engagement and conversation with its VIP players through GM's Mix & Mingle parties in the Top of the Park room. These events have become a staple the weekend prior to a signature stakes night, and provide the opportunity to discuss upcoming events with the players, while also asking feedback to strategies already in play. Players enjoy complimentary hors d'oeuvres and drinks to go along with the opportunity to win a special VIP MegaBet on the signature event tied to that specific Mix & Mingle. Implemented in 2021, the Mix & Mingles have seen continued growth with attendance and have become a popular event for our very best horseplayers.

Harrah's Hoosier Park's player development team will continue to market racing-specific events to hosted guests and promote racing activities to non-racing dominant guests who have a propensity to gamble on racing or enjoy racing-related activities and events.



HORSESHOE INDIANAPOLIS 2025 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY



After a record breaking 2024 it is with great pride that we report to the Indiana Horse Racing Commission that we exceeded that handle and set another new record in 2025. All of this accomplished despite an historic amount of rainfall that has severely limited turf racing, especially throughout the early part of the meet.

After a total handle of over \$315,000,000 in 2024, which included Horseshoe Indianapolis' continued foray into International Simulcasting, it was expected to be a tall task to match that number in 2025. But the quality of racing with both breeds has improved to the level that our product is now nationally and internationally respected and relied upon as never before. The proof is seen in our consistent weekly simulcasting results and the continued growth of our Indiana Derby, Miss Roxie Little Futurity, Indiana Champions Day and other premier events. There is no question that Horseshoe Indianapolis racing has become an important product for horse bettors all over the world.

Speaking of the Indiana Derby – this year's version was another record-breaking success. The event, which has found its home on the first Saturday in July, was again shown via national broadcasts on Fox Sports and TVG. Both networks sent their own talent and equipment and further proved that Indiana's greatest race has turned into a nationwide must-see event. The winner of the race, Tip Top Thomas, returned to win his next outing over high-level three-year olds so it's apparent that the quality needed to compete in Indiana is at its highest level ever. That day's handle of \$9.1 million in our own pools set a new record but when you consider the growth in International wagering, it is likely that the all-in total handle was somewhere close to \$10 million.

Although the Thoroughbred program is thriving the quarter horse program also continues to ascend both regionally and nationally and the horses and horsemen who race at our facility can compete just about anywhere as well. With the 2024 upgrade of the QHRAI Station Service Auction Futurity and the Miss Roxie Little to Grade 3 races we do expect that Quarter Horse racing fans around the country will be even more focused on our program in Indiana in the coming years.

The 2025 season got off to a solid start. As has been mentioned many times, the wintertime training clearly helps with the beginning of our meet and at one point in late February we had nearly 700 horses on the grounds preparing for the April 15th season opener. The surface has held up well and we're happy to say the wintertime training was very safe for our equine population.

Included in the participation of wintertime training this year was more Quarter Horses than any season prior. With the new springtime Quarter Horse meet taking place in Kentucky, Horseshoe Indianapolis is a good place for our Indiana horsemen to prepare not only for our own meet but to get some starts in prior to that in Kentucky.

It's appropriate to mention our racing surfaces and the pride we take in the work our staff has done to produce the safest racetrack in the country in 2024. Statistically speaking the safety results, as reported by the Jockey Club, for Horseshoe Indianapolis in 2024 were first in terms of the health and welfare of our equine athletes. Several national publications went out of their way to report these findings and much goodwill has been created. As we approach the end of our 2025 meet it is encouraging to report that we are tracking similar to last year and those excellent results.

With the relatively uncertain times in racing we have stayed vigilant in being prepared for the financial impacts of HISA. It has been important to closely review the purse monies available with our horsemen and Jessica Barnes. We're pleased to report that despite a HISA bill of more than \$3 million in 2025, that we have not had to cut purses to this point. We will watch closely for any upcoming changes as it is expected that our share of HISA expenses will increase by nearly \$300,000 in 2026.

As we prepare for the final month of our 2025 season, and in closing, it goes without saying that we believe the partnership that we have with our horsemen is key to the success of our racing business. As the handle continues to grow it is our belief that we will see our product ascend through the list of tracks nationally and become even stronger in the future. It is especially pleasing to see results like we had in July where Horseshoe Indianapolis handled more than any month in the history of Indiana racing. In addition, during Indiana Derby week, we surpassed the \$20 million weekly-handle mark and were the second leading track that week in terms of handle; beating the likes of Ellis Park, Gulfstream Park, Woodbine and other prominent racetracks. Those results were unheard of several years ago and we look forward to seeing our racing product continue its rise among

the industry leaders.





HORSESHOE INDIANAPOLIS 2025 HIGHLIGHTS

- A record 712 horses are on the property as the official start to the training season begins on March 2nd. The previous three-plus months of winter training had a perfect safety record for our equine athletes.
- Opening day, April, 15th, goes off without a hitch 9 races and a record opening day handle of over \$2.6 million
- The Kentucky Derby takes place on May 3rd and Horseshoe has a large crowd, despite persistent rain. Rain will be a theme throughout the meet.
- Horseshoe Indianapolis was selected as the #3 Best Place to Work (Large Company Category) by the Indiana Chamber of Commerce from a pool of 1,300 businesses.
- For the second straight year, torrential rain inundates the Shelbyville area prior to the May 14th running of the Caesars Stakes and Horseshoe Indianapolis Stakes and Swifty and Sagamore Sired Handicaps. But the results are encouraging, despite the poor conditions, with an off-the-turf program handling more than \$3.6 million.
- The first all Quarter Horse card on May 31st is a banner day with a Quarter horse record handle of over \$1.2 million. Up considerably over the same date in 2024.
- Rain keeps stalling momentum early in the meet as through May there were more days off-the-turf than on-the-turf (7 vs 9)
- Even without a Belmont Stakes on the line the live racing card at Horseshoe Indianapolis handles over \$2.3 million.
- Thursday, June 12th begins Horseshoe Indianapolis' presence on Fox Sports along with Belmont Park. Horseshoe Indianapolis will be featured on Thursdays in June, September and October and further increasing the Indiana brand nationally.
- · A banner Thursday on June 26th where Fox Sports keys a \$3.4 million day.

- More than \$1.1 million is wagered on the all Quarter Horse program on June 28th. The card consists of 13 races with 11 of those being Stakes Trials for the Gordon Mobley and Heartland Futurity races.
- Between June 1st and June 30th Shelbyville is gripped with incessant rain. Horseshoe Indianapolis feels the pain as 9 of the 17 days of racing between those days are taken off-the-turf.
- July 1st starts Indiana Derby Week and the results are excellent. Through the course of the week, over \$20 million is wagered during the span of 5 racing days.
- July 5th is a spectacular day of racing at Horseshoe Indianapolis. With 13 races, including the Grade 3 Indiana Oaks and Grade 3 Indiana Derby, a new single-day handle record is set at \$9,143,675. That figure does not include International wagering so the actual figure is likely closer to \$10 million on the day.
- July 19th brings an exceptional day of Quarter Horse racing with the Finals of The Jaguar Rocket and Gordon Mobley Futurities. Handle exceeds 2024 again – this time just missing \$900k.
- The 2025 rendition of the Governor's and First Lady Handicaps brings a healthy \$3 million in handle on July 30th.
- July ends at it becomes the highest monthly handle in Indiana racing history with \$49.8
 million wagered in the month. And that includes taking the traditional mid-summer
 break late in July.
- Friday, August 8th turns into a major new event on-track. The annual Pink Out Night is moved to this evening to participate alongside HHP on Dan Patch Day. The event raises almost \$7,000 to be given to Indiana Women in Need (I.W.I.N) and the luxury item giveaways are a huge hit. To end the evening, HBPA President Joe Davis generously donates \$1,500 to buy a jockey statue painted in Pink.
- Rains return and takes a toll on the program. From August 12 August 21 there are 8 scheduled race days and on only one of them is Horseshoe Indianapolis able to use the turf course.
- August 29th is the 5th all Quarter Horse racing program and it's highlighted by a victory by A Flare for Politics in the Grade 3 QHRAI Station Service Auction Futurity.
- Carryovers in the Late Pick 4 and Late Pick 5 help the Friday, September 5th program to a
 huge day with nearly \$4.4 million wagered. On the day Horseshoe is the #1 afternoon
 simulcast signal on the day beating the likes of Gulfstream Park, Woodbine, Laurel and
 others.
- Hoosier Day, an event created two years ago, has made a big splash on the national scene. This year's version on October 1st is a huge hit and generates a handle of more than \$4.2 million over 11 races.
- The 6th running of Indiana Champions Day takes place on Saturday, October 25th and Horseshoe Indianapolis is packed with a great crowd on the apron and clubhouse. In addition, a visit from the Governor and the First Lady of Indiana, Mike and Maureen Braun highlights the day. Governor Braun presents the trophy for the \$250,000 Unreachable Star.



Horseshoe Indianapolis continued to work hard in 2025 to bring in new sponsors and businesses into the racing business in Shelbyville. With a strong basis returning from 2024 Sponsorships it was an excellent year for promoting our racing product to more and more people across the Indianapolis metro area.



2026 CAPITAL INVESTMENTS AND SAFETY PLAN

The 2026 Horseshoe Indianapolis Capital Investment schedule was extensive with an original plan to purchase 11 Security Vehicles and Buses at a total of \$984,194. While there had previously been intent for a number of replacement Shuttle Buses and Security Vehicles, there was a clear opportunity to use some of the Capital on more pressing track maintenance needs. After a thorough review of our current fleet, it was respectfully requested that a substitution plan be put into place. The following 2026 purchases were approved at a total of \$862,831:

MARKETING & BUDGET OVERVIEW

Horseshoe Indianapolis once again completed a very successful season of events. Each year, the team works to enhance and improve specialty nights through additional advertising as well as specialized targeted marketing in Central Indiana. Four billboards are in place annually to keep horse racing top of mind for residents in the area along with expanded awareness on social media platforms, an ever-growing outlet to boost awareness for racing.

Horseshoe Indianapolis' first marquee event was Kentucky Derby Day with standing room only on the apron. Guests enjoyed winner's circle giveaways, a free selfie station, and activities for the young racing fans with live racing coinciding with the program from Churchill Downs. The day was also the conclusion of the 16-week contest Road to Louisville, which continues to grow in popularity, attracting play from more than 500 people nationally with bankrolls to the top five finishers as well as two National Horseplayer Championship seats.

The top five players from Road to Louisville returned for Horseshoe Indianapolis' premier event, the 31st running of the Grade 3 Indiana Derby Saturday, July 5 featuring eight premier races with purses exceeding \$1.1 million. Horseshoe Indianapolis went into partnership with the Indiana Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association (HBPA) to offer the \$2,500 Indiana Derby Legends contest, attracting nearly 400 entries. The day also included a \$3,000 Derby Megabet drawing, winner's circle giveaways, a cigar rolling station, Magic Mirror selfies, and food trucks to enhance the day.

New in 2025 was the implementation of a ladies' themed night tagged as Silks 'N Roses, raising funding and awareness for Indiana Women in Need. The night included several stations from chocolate to a flower cart with 10 female handicappers placing wagers into the Late Fire Pick 5 and drawings for premier gifts. In all, more than \$7,000 was raised for I.W.I.N. who supports local cancer patients and their families.

Quarter Horse racing also took another big step forward throughout the season playing host to the second runnings of the Restricted Grade 3 races, the QHRAI Stallion Service Auction

Futurity in late August and the Miss Roxie Little Futurity, which became the richest Quarter Horse race ever with a final purse of \$359,600 during Indiana Champions Day. Trackside activities were in place to support both days of racing, with Indiana Champions Day setting all types of records including a new all-sources handle record. The afternoon program featured a cigar rolling station, two \$3,000 Megabet drawings, and two handicapping contests. Once again, the afternoon was in partnership with QHRAI, ITOBA, and Indiana HBPA, showing the unity of all organizations to showcase the state's top Thoroughbreds and Quarter Horses.

One of the new and exciting opportunities in 2025 was the implementation of A.I. Alan through a partnership with Daily Racing Form. The animated character is powered through a special artificial intelligence platform from DRF, making A.I. Alan the first of its kind in horse racing. The character will continue to be developed for more interaction in 2026.

Horseshoe Indianapolis continues its partnership with NTRA by offering six different contests featuring seats to the NHC Finals in Las Vegas each March. A total of 18 seats were allotted throughout the year, presenting Indiana racing to a different level of horseplayers and engaging new players about the state's racing program.

Finally, Horseshoe Indianapolis shifted additional funds to advertising in 2025 with an increase of television advertising with all four networks in Indianapolis. The track took advantage of added commercials during both the Indiana Pacers and Indiana Fever playoff runs, garnering bigger audiences to promote the racing program. The track continues to keep relevant with industry advertising as well for both breeds with major events showcased on Caesars Racebook, Twinspires, FanDuel TV, Daily Racing Form, Blood Horse, and Quarter Horse major option StallionESearch, to name a few.

Note: The \$1.5 million Race Marketing Budget for 2026 compares favorably to the baseline 2019 budget of \$1,348,618.

ON-TRACK RACING VIP STRATEGY

On-track Racing VIP services continue to hold steady for racing customers. Redemptions for free programs, racing wagers, food, and other incentives are in place based on play through Caesars Rewards at Horseshoe Indianapolis. Racing fans utilizing Caesars Rewards may also redeem their points at other properties under Caesars Entertainment, making the program very lucrative for all types of perks and interests.

In addition, several new activities were held for non-racing members of Caesars Rewards in 2025, including a concert series held trackside with perks, including free food and beverage, and VIP seating as well as a special mailer directing guests to the racing side for an exclusive drawing during Empire of Hope. These opportunities are in place to bridge the gap between casino-based players with hopes of exposing them to the racing side of the facility.

Racing VIP Services continue to be active in bigger racing events, such as Indiana Derby and Indiana Champions Day, and Caesars Race and Sportsbook teams continue to expand their options for engagement with players seeking to expand their interest in horse racing.

MARKETING & BUDGET OVERVIEW (CONT.)

EXPORT STRATEGY

Horseshoe Indianapolis' efforts to reach horseplayers outside of Indiana is an ongoing team effort. It all starts from the racing office assembling quality racing programs and is supported through the mutuel department analyzing and setting optimal post time slots daily to ensure Indiana's races are in the prime spot for viewing and wagering. Each entity works hard to ensure Indiana's racing program has the best placement among the competition and can be a juggling act at times for mutuels to stay in between the bigger tracks. However, results for wagering are paying off. With the engagement of online contests throughout the season, exposure and awareness are at an all-time high. In fact, Horseshoe Indianapolis is now listed in the top portion of Equibase's daily listing of tracks, a first in history for Indiana Thoroughbred racing. The mutuel department continues to find new ways to capture additional crowds and promote the signal to off-site wagering platforms, which has now expanded overseas.

In 2025, more than \$125,000 was offered in contest play with the majority of those funds available to online players in addition to on track handicappers. The participation continues to expand, showing the current strategies of engagement with players across North America is showing growth. These contests, combined with National Horseplayer Championship seats during the season have attracted a whole new audience of players, adding value to wagering.

INITIATIVES FOR BOTH THOROUGHBRED AND QUARTER HORSE RACING IN 2025 INCLUDES:

- Continued involvement with FanDuel TV coverage during the week through the "pay to play" plan to add live racing on their broadcast
- Continued Quarter Horse racing programs at late morning post times to attract wagering through export locations such as FanDuel TV and Twinspires with little or no competition while providing on track promotions and events
- Continued support from nationally known handicappers for both breeds to enhance specialty events and social media presence to engage new followers

- · Continued online handicapping contests to attract horseplayers nationally with enticing prize money and formats
- Search for additional opportunities to cross promote with other Caesars Entertainment owned racing properties, including the new Harrah's property in Columbus, Nebraska
- Explore new avenues in advertising such as OTT and A.I. options and partnership opportunities with Quarter Horse racing.
- Continued work with sportsbooks across the country owned by Caesars for better shelf visuals as well as continued promotional giveaways and ways to link players to Horseshoe Indianapolis racing
- Caesars Racebook expanded perks and promotions, including Two-Times points on all Caesars Entertainment racing properties

ADVERTISING BUYS

The marketing department took another step forward and increased advertising buys, especially with television in Central Indiana. The buys were increased across the board with all four major networks. Special segments featuring "Racing" Rachel McLaughlin continued on all four networks, capturing large audience numbers in anticipation of major events centered around Indiana Derby, Silks 'N Roses, and Indiana Champions Day. In addition, general commercials ran to promote other summer events including Kentucky Derby Day, Quarter Horse racing, Boots 'N Brews, Pups and Ponies, and Empire of Hope.

Additionally, radio spots were purchased in the Greencastle, Ind. area once again in 2025 for the second straight year focused on Quarter Horse racing. A large number of Quarter Horse racing fans and supporters live in that immediate area, so the target was to enhance their knowledge about specific racing dates for the sprinters.

Daily weather segments continued for the fourth year with WRTV Channel 6 to enhance the "Wire to Wire" show featuring Racing Rachel McLaughlin and John Dooley prior to each racing program. Advertising also continued locally on all Shelby County venues, including WSVX Giant FM, Shelby News, and Shelby County Post.

Industry trade advertisement remained as a focus also throughout the year, providing content on options such as Paulick Report, Blood Horse, StallionESearch (Quarter Horse), Daily Racing Form, Horse Racing Happy Hour, Horse Racing Radio Network, Down the Stretch Sirius Radio, Steve Byk's At the Races, The Pressbox, and Horse Racing Nation, who provided daily statistical work to elevate the racing program. New in 2025 was a buy with The Business-y Podcast, focused on women in business to support Silks 'N Roses.

GROUP SALES INITIATIVES

Horseshoe Indianapolis has a sales and banquets team providing group opportunities during the season, many of which are combined with racing. The team is committed to providing group experiences during live racing. Several of the private rooms. Also, many of the larger racing days utilized space under the new trackside awning in 2024. Racing specific group outings were also provided, including visits and tours to the jockey's quarters for veterinary groups, University of Tennessee racetrack program students, and National FFA Week guests.

HARRAH'S HOOSIER PARK COMMUNITY GIVING



Every year, teams from Harrah's Hoosier Park actively engage in community volunteer efforts throughout Anderson, contributing to initiatives such as tackling issues of homelessness and building homes with Habitat for Humanity. Through Empire of Hope, Harrah's Hoosier Park remains a steadfast supporter of this cause—helping to raise a record-breaking \$73,000 this year for the Alliance.

Alongside its local contributions, Harrah's Hoosier Park secures additional support from the Caesars Entertainment Foundation to benefit community organizations. This year, a total of \$45,000 was distributed amongst four local charities.



HORSESHOE INDIANAPOLIS COMMUNITY GIVING

Once again, Horseshoe Indianapolis Racing & Casino was heavily involved in community support in 2025. With a total of \$525,000, more than 77 percent of the budget aided causes and organizations located in Shelby County and the City of Shelbyville.

Horseshoe Indianapolis placed a focus on raising funds for SCUFFY (Shelby County United Fund For You) which is spread over a dozen major organizations contributing directly to the well-being of residents in the immediate area. Organizations receiving direct donations from SCUFFY include Meals on Wheels, Shelby Senior Services, Boys and Girls Club, Girls Inc., Salvation Army, and the Cancer Association of Shelby County. Horseshoe Indianapolis is proud to remain as a Pacesetter sponsor for SCUFFY in supporting these worthwhile organizations.

The Boys and Girls Club of Shelby County now includes four locations and directly impacts children of Horseshoe Indianapolis team members and horsemen and women. A donation of \$38,400 was allotted to Boys and Girls Club with Girls Inc also receiving an additional \$25,000 for their programs.

Horseshoe Indianapolis is also a proud supporter of those who serve and protect the community. A \$25,000 was made to the new Shelbyville Police Department K-9 unit. Members of the Senior Leadership Team provided free lunch on September 11 to all service individuals from the police, fire, and other local agencies. The team served more than 250 individuals during the special luncheon in downtown Shelbyville.

While casino operations support local organizations, racing operations place the focus on organizations directly related to racing. With \$70,000 allotted for equine related giving, more than \$29,000 is earmarked to racehorse aftercare programs. Each year, the track hosts Empire of Hope with eight different organizations providing booths and materials to explain their purpose and need in the Thoroughbred and Quarter Horse racing industries. Former racehorses are showcased in "Parade of Champions" during the races, showing second careers for these prior.

Each year, several weekend racing dates are linked to various organizations linked to racing at Horseshoe Indianapolis. The track participates in the annual PDJF Racing Across America, raising funding and awareness for the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDJF). Jockeys wear special arm bands during racing, and the World Jockey Challenge provides a backdrop for all jockeys to compete on the card representing their home countries. In addition, Horseshoe Indianapolis is an ongoing sponsor of the annual Jockeys and Jeans event, bringing former jockeys together to raise funding for those who are currently in the program for PDJF due to career ending injuries.

Additional weekend racing programs linked to local charities included Pups and Ponies, featuring dogs from Canine Castaways in Fountaintown, Ind., and new in 2025 was Silks & Roses, raising funding and awareness for Indiana Women in Need (I.W.I.N.). The evening included numerous stations, from flower bouquets to t-shirts to chocolate, with all proceeds to I.W.I.N.


