Commission members present: Thomas Weatherwax, Chairman; Greg Schenkel, Vice-Chairman; George Pillow, member; and William McCarty, member. Also present were Mike Smith, IHRC Executive Director; Deena Pitman, IHRC Assistant Executive Director; Lea Ellingwood, IHRC General Counsel; Holly Newell, IHRC Deputy General Counsel; Jessica Barnes, IHRC Director of Racing and Breed Development; Stan Bowker, Senior Steward at Indiana Grand; Attorney John Shanks; John Keeler, General Counsel for Hoosier Park; Roger Young, Attorney for the Indiana Standardbred Association; ; Jim Brown, President and Chief Operating Officer at Hoosier Park; Rick Moore, Vice President and General Manager of Racing at Hoosier Park;

**I. Call to Order**

Chairman Weatherwax called the meeting to order at approximately 9:00 a.m. A quorum was present.

**II. Approval of minutes of the March 15, 2016 meeting.**

Commissioner Schenkel moved to accept the minutes for the meeting of March 15, 2016. Commissioner McCarty seconded the motion. The minutes were approved, 4-0.

**III. Agenda**

1. Consideration of the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order Granting IHRC Staff's Motion of Summary Judgment in the matter of Scott McNair (IHRC Ruling No. 15600).

General Counsel Lea Ellingwood presented the ALJ's Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Recommended Order Granting IHRC Staff's Motion of Summary Judgment. Vice Chairman Schenkel moved to approve the Order, Commissioner Pillow seconded. The motion passed, 4-0.

2. Consideration of the Administrative Law Judge's Recommended Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, Ultimate Findings of Fact and Recommended Order in the matter of Juan DeLeon Guerrero.

John Shanks, counsel for Juan Guerrero, and IHRC General Counsel Ellingwood presented their cases, with Staff objecting to the Commission hearing Guerrero's objections due to the timeliness of the filing. Commissioner McCarty moved to allow the objections to be entered as part of the record. Commissioner Pillow seconded. The Commissioners voted 4-0 to consider the objections.

Commissioner Schenkel moved to approve the recommended Order granting Staff's Motion for Summary Judgment. Commissioner Pillow seconded. The motion passed, 4-0.

3. Consideration of Addendum to the 2016 Agreement Between Hoosier Park, LLC and the Indiana Standardbred Association (ISA).

John Keeler, General Counsel for Hoosier Park, and Roger Young, attorney for the ISA, presented a change to the 2016 Agreement between Hoosier Park and the ISA. The change consisted of a \$187.50 daily increase in the retention from the ISA's share of simulcast revenues to accommodate the new high definition television broadcast system at Hoosier Park.

Commissioner McCarty moved to approve the amendment. Commissioner Schenkel seconded. The Commissioners voted 4-0, for approval.

4. Review of commission rulings: March 1, 2016 – April 30, 2016.

General Counsel Holly Newell presented the rulings.

Rick Moore, Vice President and General Manager of Racing at Hoosier Park, presented the details of the program that would allow a group of 50 people to own a racehorse together for a nominal fee and to race at Hoosier Park. The program has been named First Turn Stable.



PETITION

Comes now Petitioners Centaur Holdings, LLC (Centaur), New Centaur, LLC (New Centaur) and Hoosier Park, LLC (Hoosier Park), by counsel, and respectfully request that the Indiana Horse Racing Commission (Commission) approve the construction of an administration building and gate house at Hoosier Park. In support of such Petition, Petitioners show the Commission as follows:


1. Centaur is the owner of New Centaur, which is the owner of Hoosier Park;
2. Hoosier Park is the holder of a permit to conduct a horse racing meeting at Hoosier Park, which permit was issued by the Commission pursuant to IC 4-31-5-8. The permit issued to Hoosier Park was most recently renewed by the Commission at its regular meeting on December 9, 2015;
3. Pursuant to 71 IAC 11-1-16, Hoosier Park seeks Commission approval to construct an administration building consisting of 9,361 square feet that would be located on the backside of Hoosier Park in the approximate location shown on Exhibit A, appear essentially as depicted on the artist's rendering attached as Exhibit B, and be constructed in accordance with the floor plan illustrated on Exhibit C (Administration Building). Further, Hoosier Park seeks approval to construct a gate house in the location shown on Exhibit A, which would look essentially similar to the artist's rendering depicted on Exhibit D and have the floor plan shown on Exhibit E (Gate House). The Administration Building would house the offices of the Commission, Hoosier Park Race and Security Department offices, track chaplain and Indiana Standardbred Association medical facilities. The Gate House would be an aesthetically pleasing addition to the backside and provide for backside security.
4. The estimated cost of the Administration Building and Gate House is Three Million Dollars (\$3,000,000) (Estimated Construction Cost). Because the Estimated Construction Cost exceeds Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000), construction of the Administration Building and

Gate House are considered "material modifications" under the Commission's rules (71 IAC 11-1-16) and require Commission approval.

5. Approval of Petitioners' request to construct the Administration Building and Gate House is in the best interests of Indiana horse racing.

WHEREFORE, Petitioners respectfully request that the Commission approve the construction of the Administration Building and Gate House, and grant all other relief as may be right and proper in the premises.

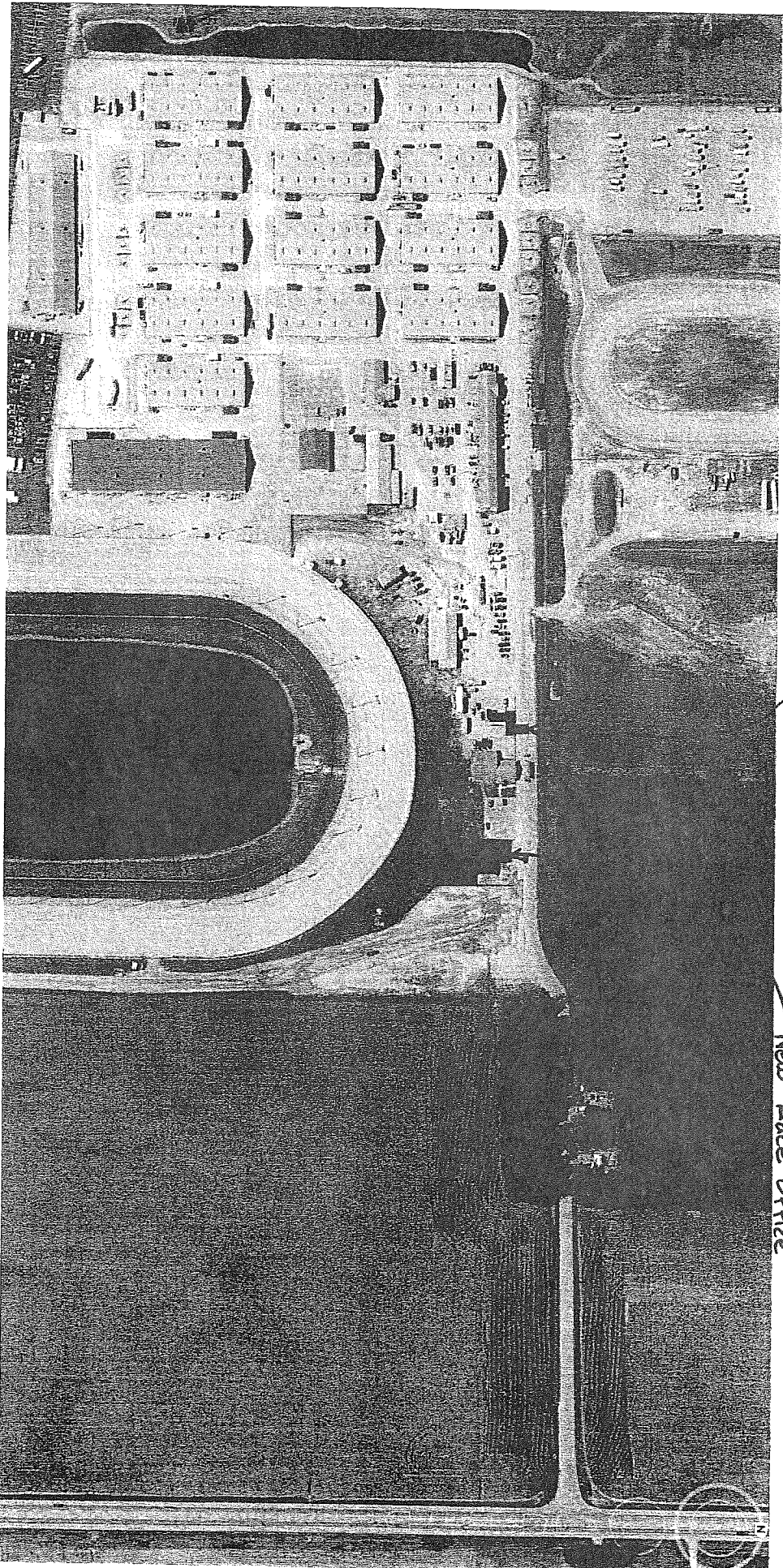

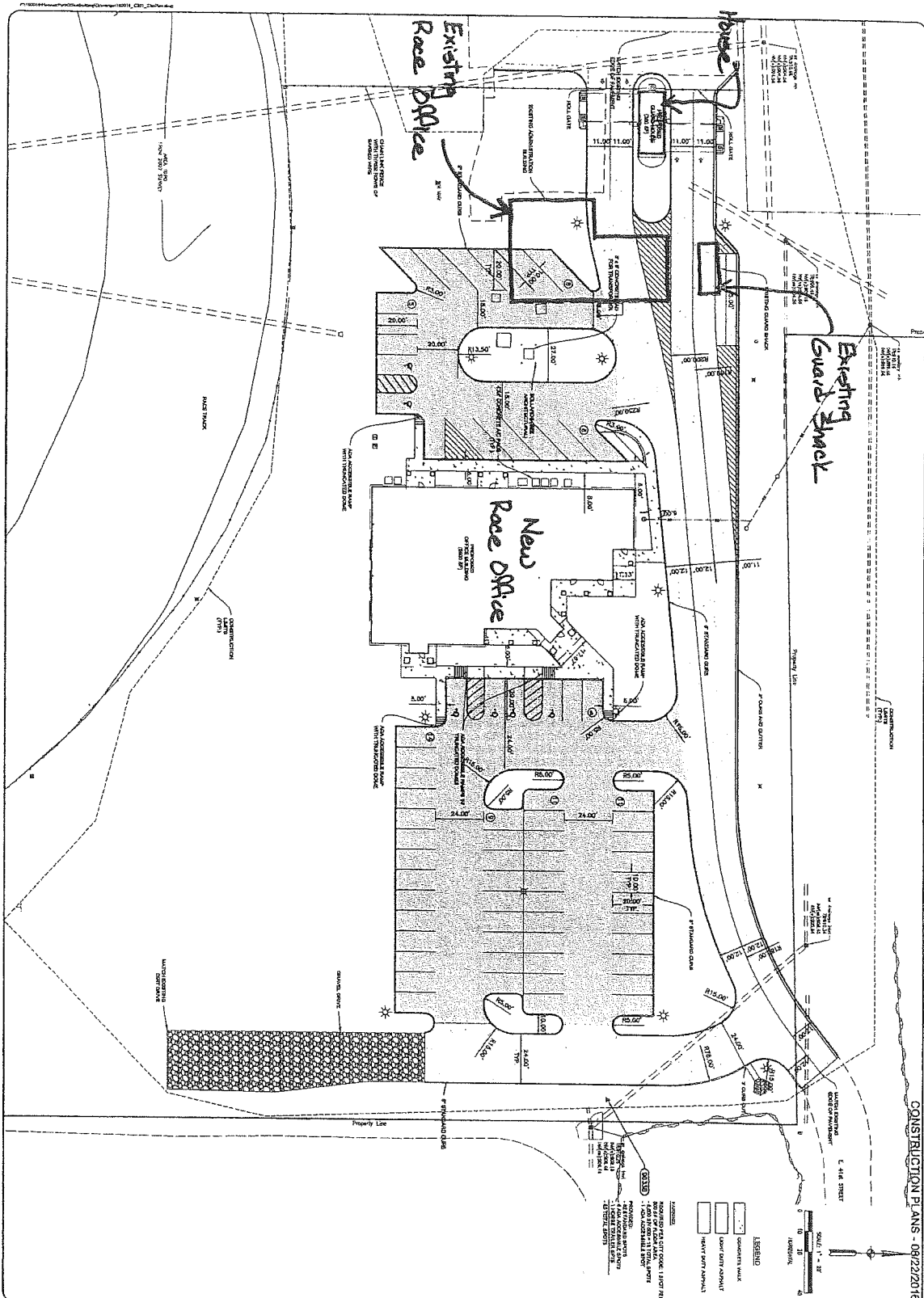
New Gate House

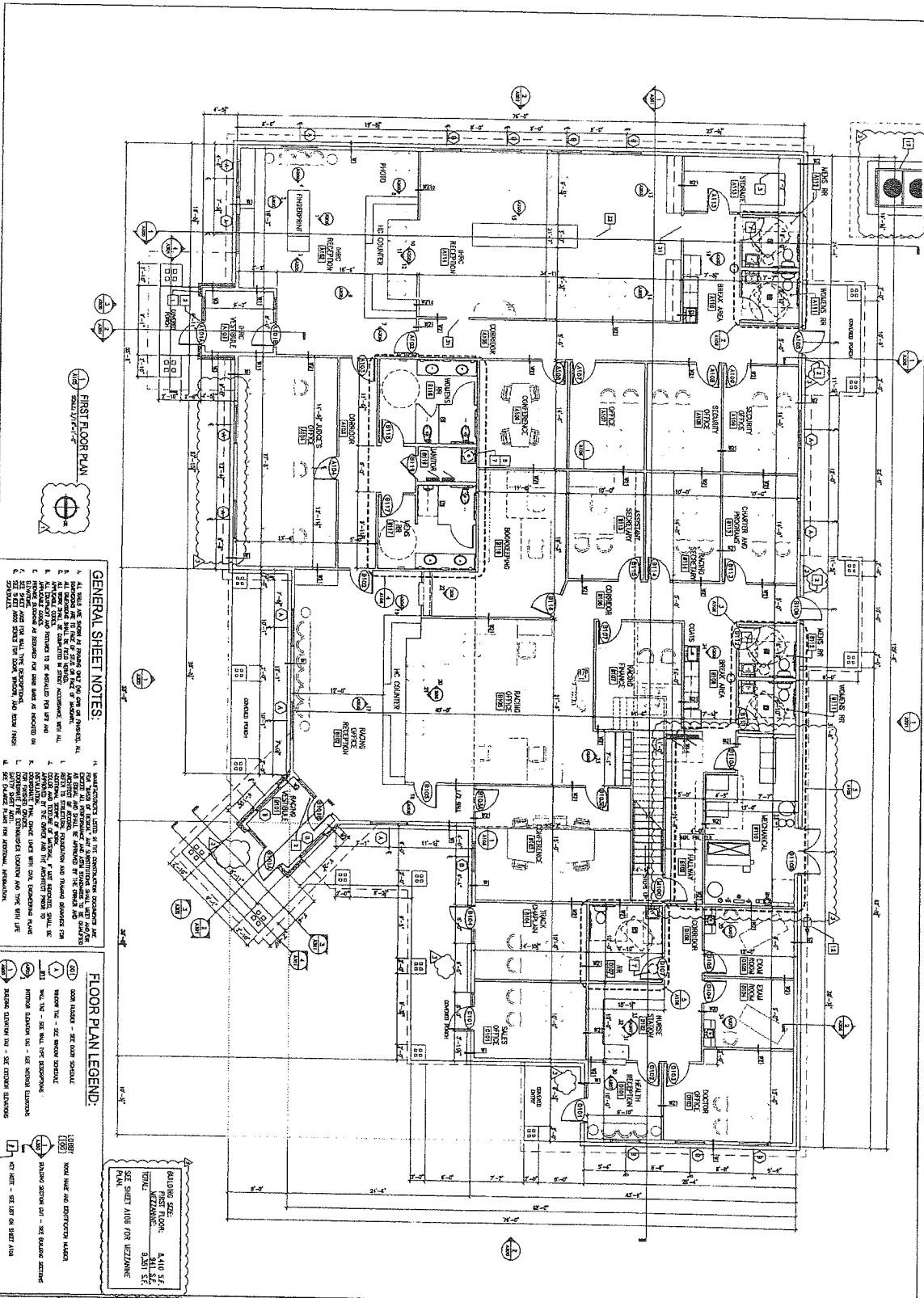
